Narrative:

On Wednesday, July 17, 2024, at 2110 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Joseph Goudy (Goudy) conducted an interview with Medina County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) Correction Officer Sean Barker (Barker). This was in reference to an officer involved critical incident which occurred earlier in the day at the front doors of the MCSO building. Correction Officer Barker was working inside the control booth of the MCSO county jail at the time of the incident.

Correction Officer Barker stated that while he was inside the control booth, he answered the intercom which was located at the front door of the facility. Correction Officer Barker stated that at approximately 1800 hours, a male was heard saying, "a female is waving around a gun intoxicated." Soon thereafter, the male walked away. Correction Officer Barker stated he did not recall the number to dispatch to alert them to this, so he contacted another deputy he observed walking into the building. With the intercom still open, Correction Officer Barker stated he heard what sounded like a taser go off. Correction Officer Barker further stated that the female was heard "screaming a lot" while outside but could not make out what she was saying. Correction Officer Barker did not hear or see anything further.
