On January 20th, 2026, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested by the Pickaway County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) to investigate an officer involved critical incident. As part of the investigation, Crime Scene Technician (CST) Holly Ryczek responded to the Ashville Police Department (APD) at the above-mentioned address to process the involved officers.

CST Ryczek arrived at the station at approximately 1800 hours. She was advised that two APD Officers, one South Bloomfield Police Department Officer, and one PCSO Deputy had discharged their duty weapons. All officers and deputy located at the station were observed to be in their agency issued uniforms and advised they were dressed as they were at the time of the incident. The specifics of each officer are detailed below:

- [REDACTED] - **Ashville Police Department:** Reportedly discharged his duty pistol during the incident. His duty pistol was a Glock 45 9mm pistol (S/N: [REDACTED]) with a TLR-1 HL Streamlight weapon light attached to the frame and a Holosun sight attached to the slide. It was found with one WIN 9mm Luger cartridge in the chamber and a seated magazine containing 14 WIN 9mm Luger cartridges. His duty belt contained two additional fully loaded magazines. His pistol, magazine, and cartridges were collected as Item #1.
- [REDACTED] - **Ashville Police Department:** Reportedly discharged his duty pistol during the incident. His duty pistol was a Glock 45 9mm pistol (S/N: [REDACTED]) with a TLR-1 HL Streamlight weapon light attached to the frame and a Holosun sight attached to the slide. It was found with one WIN 9mm Luger cartridge in the chamber and a seated magazine containing 17 WIN 9mm Luger cartridges. [REDACTED] advised he performed a reload, so the fully loaded magazine seated inside the weapon was not the magazine used during the

incident. The magazine that was used contained 15 WIN 9mm Luger cartridges. His duty belt contained one additional fully loaded magazine. His pistol, magazines, and cartridges were collected as Item #2.

- [REDACTED] – **South Bloomfield Police Department:** Reportedly discharged his duty pistol during the incident. His duty pistol was a Glock 45 9mm pistol (S/N: [REDACTED]) with a TLR-1 HL Streamlight weapon light attached to the frame and a Holosun sight attached to the slide. It was found with one WIN 9mm Luger cartridge in the chamber and a seated magazine containing 9 WIN 9mm Luger cartridges. His duty belt contained two additional fully loaded magazines. His pistol, magazine, and cartridges were collected as Item #3.
- [REDACTED] – **Pickaway County Sheriff's Office:** Reportedly discharged his duty pistol during the incident. He advised his pistol was still on scene (see CST Cruvey's *Crime Scene Processing* report for pistol documentation). His duty vest contained one fully loaded 9mm magazine. [REDACTED] and his magazine were photographed for documentation purposes.

No further action was taken regarding the involved officers.

CST Ryczek cleared from the station at approximately 1845 hours and arrived at 4800 Duvall Road Lot #303 (Scene #1) at approximately 1858 hours.

CST Cruvey transferred all items of evidence from Scene #1 to CST Ryczek at approximately 2334 hours. CST Ryczek then cleared from Scene #1 at approximately 02345 hours.

CST Ryczek arrived at BCI Headquarters in London, Ohio at approximately 0025 hours on January 21, 2026. CST Ryczek transferred all items from Scene #1 and Scene #2 to a temporary storage locker at approximately 0030 hours.
