Narrative:

On 10/15/2025 at 0815 hours, S/A Hammond retrieved item 15 from drying cabinet #3 at the Bowling Green office of BCI. The white/gray sweatshirt was laid out onto clean Kraft paper for examination. The item was photographed as it was found.

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Further examination of the shirt located four areas of damage that would be visually consistent with a projectile passing through the fabric. The first two areas of damage were located in the left sleeve area.

Both areas of damage were consistent with a medium caliber projectile passing through the fabric. Both areas of damage were in line with one another, approximately 14" above the cuff of the sleeve. The margins of the outside hole had a punched-out appearance with the threads pushed inward. The area of damage along the inside edge appeared ragged with the thread pulled outward. There did not appear to be any visible concentration of stippling present.

Examination of the rear panel of the sweatshirt located two additional areas of damage that would be consistent with a projectile passing through the fabric. The first area of damage was located near the left seam, approximately 7" from the bottom. The second area of damage was located on the right side, approximately 2" from the bottom. Both areas of damage were consistent with a medium caliber projectile. The holes had a punched-out appearance, with the margins pushed inwards. There did not appear to be any visible concentration of stippling present.

It should be noted that the sweatshirt was in poor condition due to the removal by emergency medical responders. Additional damage to the shirt may be present but obscured by the damage created by cutting it.

At the conclusion of the examination, the sweatshirt was wrapped in clean, Kraft paper and returned to its original packaging.
