**Narrative:**

On 08/25/23, Special Agent (SA) Jason Snyder (Snyder) with the Ohio Attorney General's Office Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) conducted a recorded interview of Patrolman (Ptl.) Lance Brunswick (Brunswick). The interview was conducted at Eastview Park, located at 2001 E. Livingston St., Celina, Oh. 45822.

Both SA Snyder and Ptl. Brunswick agreed to meet this date and location. Ptl. Brunswick was advised that he did not have to talk to SA Snyder and he could leave at any time. Ptl. Brunswick voluntarily agreed to speak to SA Snyder.

SA Snyder asked Ptl. Brunswick a little about himself. Ptl. Brunswick has a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice. Ptl. Brunswick has been with St. Mary's Police Department (St. Mary's PD) since 2020. He currently works patrol. His hours of work are from 0000 to 0800. He was well rested the day before work and does not wear any corrective eyewear. Ptl. Brunswick wears the normal duty uniform issued to him by St. Mary's PD. His radio unit number is 104.

SA Snyder asked Ptl. Brunswick about an incident that occurred on 08/25/23 in Celina, Oh. Ptl. Brunswick heard on the radio that there were "shoots fired" in Celina. Due to this, Ptl. Brunswick and several other officers from St. Mary's PD responded to the area to assist.

When Ptl. Brunswick arrived, he made contact with Celina Police Department (Celina PD) Officers. He was directed to assist officers attending to Corey Andrew (Andrew) who was still seated in the driver's side front part of the vehicle.

When Ptl. Brunswick started to assist the officers with Andrew, he noticed that Andrew had an injury which had been bleeding onto the floorboard of the vehicle. Ptl. Brunswick went to his cruiser and retrieved his medical supplies.

When Ptl. Brunswick returned, officers had pulled Andrew from the vehicle and were providing

medical treatment to him. One officer was placing pressure to Andrew's left shoulder. Ptl. Brunswick was given a bandage and he placed it on Andrew's shoulder to help with blood control.

Ptl. Brunswick saw that there was a gunshot wound on Andrew's left leg. He gave another officer his tourniquet and this tourniquet was placed on Andrew's leg to control the bleeding. At this same time, EMS arrived and started additional medical treatment to Andrew.

Ptl. Brunswick finished clearing the vehicle for additional people, during which he did not find anyone else in the vehicle. He also placed scene tape in the area to secure the area of the vehicle.

SA Snyder asked Ptl. Brunswick if he had activated his body worn recording device. Ptl. Brunswick had activated the device and recorded his actions during the incident.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the interview. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions.
