OPINIONS

Based upon the foregoing and in specific answer to your inquiry, you are advised that when the county commissioners acquire land for widening or straightening of county roads, an abstracter may be paid from the county treasury for an abstract or search of the records in those instances wherein the judgment of such commissioners the same is necessary in order to properly determine who are the owners of the land to be so acquired.
