- Phone number- Residential and familial information of designated public service workers pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(p) and R.C. 149.43(A)(7)-(8)
- Address-Residential and familial information of designated public service workers pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(p) and R.C. 149.43(A)(7)-(8)
- Employee ID numbers- 149.433 (2) and (3). Employee ID numbers are not public record, pursuant to R.C. 149.433 (2) and (3) also see R.C. 1306.23.
- LE firearm Serial Number and other security records- Law enforcement firearm serial number redacted pursuant to R.C. 149.433
- All officers work shifts- R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(uu), “Records of the past, current, and future work schedule of a designated public service worker. As used in division (A)(1)(uu) of this section, ‘work schedule’ does not include the docket of cases of a court, judge, or magistrate.
- SSN-149.43(A)(1)(dd) 149.45(A)(1)(a)- *State ex rel. Office of Montgomery County Pub. Defender v. Siroki*, 108 Ohio St.3d 207, 842 N.E.2d 508, 2006-Ohio-662, ¶ 18; R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd); and R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(a).
- Driver’s license number-R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(C)18 U.S.C. § 2741, Driver’s license numbers are considered personal information, exempt from disclosure, pursuant to R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(c), and are further protected from disclosure by the Driver’s Privacy Protection Act of 1994. 18 U.S.C. § 2741.
- OHLEG photos documents and audits- Information, data, and statistics obtained from the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG) database, pursuant to 109.57(D)(1)(b)
- CCH- Information from the Computerized Criminal History (CCH) National Crime Information Center (NCIC) systems, pursuant to R.C. 109.57 and O.A.C. 4501:2-10-06(C)
- Autopsy photos & reports- Autopsy photographs and reports, pursuant to R.C. 313.10(D)
- Medical Records - Information obtained from medical records redacted - R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a).
- EMS Run Sheet- When a run sheet created and maintained by a county emergency medical services (EMS) organization documents treatment of a living patient, the EMS organization may redact information that pertains to the patient’s medical history, diagnosis, prognosis, or medical condition R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a), and physician-patient privilege R.C.149.43(A)(1)(v), R.C. 2317.02(B), *State ex rel. Nix v. Cleveland*, 83 Ohio St.3d 379 (1998).
- LEADS-Information from the Law Enforcement Agencies Database Systems (LEADS), pursuant to O.A.C. 45-1:2-10-06(c)
- GJ records- Grand jury records, pursuant to Crim. R. 6(E)

- Telephone number of witnesses- Telephone numbers of victims or witnesses to a crime that are listed on a law enforcement record or report, pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(mm)
- Employee Disabilities-(American with Disabilities Act) Information on employee's medical condition/history compiled for medical exam required by employer to ensure employee's ability to perform job functions 29 C.F.R. 1630.14(c)(1) or Information gathered by employer who conducts voluntary medical exam of employee as part of employee health program 29 C.F.R. 1630.14 (d)(1). Records prohibited to be released under state or federal law. 29 CFR 1630.14(b)(1), (c)(1) and R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(v)
- OPERS- 145.27(A)(2) Pursuant to R.C. 145.27(A)(2) OPERS personal History forms are not public record.
- Tax return documents-Federal tax returns and return information withheld. 26 U.S.C. § 6103. State tax return- Records maintained by Ohio Dept. of Taxation and municipal corporations. R.C. 5747.18 and R.C. 718.13
- Verification of Employment- Not a "record" of the office, including salary verification for loan applications. R.C. 149.43(A)(1); *see also State ex rel. Fant v. Enright*, 66 Ohio St.3d 186, 188 (1993)
- Private Parts & Victim at Scene of Death-Photos of the victim at the scene of the death redacted. Due to their highly sensitive nature, photos of the victim at the scene of the death have been withheld, Marsy's law may apply, and A person's nude body, unless, subject to division (H)(1) of this section, the person's consent has been obtained RC 149.43 (h)
