Narrative:

On September 23, 2025, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Jesse Bynum (SA Bynum) removed Matrix item 005, a cash register drawer, from the evidence room and opened it with SA Darien Spann (Spann). Once it was opened, the contents were removed, and currency was counted by both SA Spann and SA Bynum. A monetary evidence receipt was filled out and attached to this report as the second page of the evidence receipt.

Evidence Items were created in Matrix to document the newly separated items as Matrix item 025, currency, and Matrix item 026, the interior drawer. The currency was sealed in an envelope and then SA Bynum returned Matrix item 025 - \$849.32 in U.S. Currency and Matrix item 026 - the interior drawer that were both from inside of locked Matrix item 005 to Manasa Vempati (Vempati), the owner of the BP Gas station located at 15 Pearl Road, Brunswick, Ohio. An evidence receipt was completed and attached to this report.
