Narrative:

On Friday, March 18, 2022, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) John Butterworth (SA Butterworth) received the personnel file for [REDACTED] [REDACTED] from Clinton Township Police Department (CTPD) Chief Michael Jones. SA Butterworth reviewed the personnel file and noted the following:

SA Butterworth received a large manila envelope containing several records from the Clinton Township Police Department. Included in the envelope were personnel file records, training records, internal affairs records and the CTPD Use of Force Policy. SA Butterworth reviewed the records and the following is a summation of the items included. For a complete understanding and review of the records, the reader should read the complete file information included with the complete file package.

Located within the personnel files provided from the Clinton Township Police Department, SA Butterworth located records that included copies of appointment of Deputy Sheriff with a restricted commission from the Franklin County Sheriff's Office for purposes related to being assigned to the Franklin County Drug Task Force, a copy of Officer [REDACTED] OPOTC Peace Officer Certificate, and a copy of Officer [REDACTED] commission with the Clinton Township Police Department.

Officer [REDACTED] has received several commendations and awards during his employment with the Clinton Township Police Department and involvement with the Franklin County Drug Task Force. Copies of commendations and awards are included in the file provided from CTPD. Also included are copies of thank you letters to the police department on Officer [REDACTED] actions during the course of employment as well as lifesaving awards and certificates of merit. Officer [REDACTED] received a Silver Star for Bravery in September of 2006 from the American Police Hall of Fame for actions taken during an officer involved shooting incident that year.

Included in the personnel file were also copies of paperwork that Officer [REDACTED] completed at the time of initial hiring with the agency. Copies of birth certificate, social security card, Ohio



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driver's license and an identification card from the Gahanna Police Department were included. Prior military paperwork from the United States Marine Corps and the United States Army that included Honorable Discharges and commendations from the military.

In addition to the commendations and awards, a file labeled Internal Affairs was provided to SA Butterworth as well. The Internal Affairs file was provided to BCI SA Jim Mulford for review before SA Butterworth read anything contained in the report. This was done to ensure that any information that was provided in the Internal Affairs file did not contain any paperwork that may have caused a Garrity issue with the incident under investigation. After SA Mulford reviewed the file, it was determined that no information was included about the ongoing investigation. Included in the file was a single complaint against Officer [REDACTED]. This complaint was eventually dropped by the complainant and no further actions were taken against Officer [REDACTED].

The personnel and internal affairs file are attached to this report. Please refer to the attachments for further details.

On September 2, 2021, Clinton Township Police participated in a Franklin County wide operation to combat major crimes including gun violence, narcotics violations, stolen vehicles, and the apprehension of felony offenders. During a 24-hour period called "Operation Unity" officers took numerous illegal firearms off the streets, recovered several stolen vehicles, confiscated illegal narcotics from marijuana to fentanyl, and made numerous felony arrests on individuals. County wide over 32 illegal guns were recovered, 99 felony arrests were made, and illegal drugs with a street value of over \$500,000 were seized.


SUBJECT: Chief's Award For Excellence

On behalf of the leadership of the Criminal Investigations Division, Detective [REDACTED] Clinton Township Police Department, as well as Franklin County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) Detectives Bryan Meister, James Plumb and Sgt.'s Brian Toth and Bill Duffer are hereby commended for their outstanding collaboration as part of successfully solving a tremendously difficult homicide investigation.

On January 29, 2021, FCSO investigators learned of a death that occurred three days earlier outside an apartment at 3788 Cleveland Ave. On January 26, 2021, Clinton Township Fire paramedics had responded to a report of an individual who was injured from a fall and was transported to OSU Hospital. Several hours later, Roland Johnson, succumbed to his injuries. Emergency physicians who treated Mr. Johnson became suspicious that his injuries were a result of a beating, as opposed to a fall.

Upon receipt of this development, FCSO Detectives Meister, Plumb and Sgt.'s Toth and Duffer began the investigation into Mr. Johnson's death, and enlisted the assistance of Detective [REDACTED] from the Clinton Twp. Police Department. Detective [REDACTED] was able to solicit credible intelligence from a confidential informant that Mr. Johnson had indeed been beaten in the apartment complex. Subsequently, a covert operation was arranged, whereby the three individuals who participated in the beating were identified. As a result, Casey Harper, Devin Robinson and Quincey Anderson were taken into custody and confessed to their involvement in the murder and robbery of Roland Johnson. All three were slated into the Franklin County Jail on charges of aggravated murder.

Despite the extreme challenges they faced, the diligence, coordination and professionalism displayed by Detectives [REDACTED] Meister, Plumb along with Sgt.'s Toth and Duffer are indicative of the caliber of personnel who dedicate their lives to the furtherance of justice and the battle against violent crime in our communities. It is with our sincere pleasure to present each of them with a small token of our gratitude, a *Chief's Award For Excellence* coin, for a job exceptionally well done.



Sir on 05/11/2013 your officer, [REDACTED] and I were dispatched to 2202 Aberdeen ave. on a suicide attempt. When the dispatch went out the victim was unconscious. We didn't anticipate any kind of confrontation. When we got to the scene we were met by the victims girlfriend who was frantic and holding a Japanese sword. She, quickly, explained that the victim was holding another Japanese sword. We entered the residence and the victim was on the floor with wild eyes and in a defensive posture with the sword in his hand. We later learned that the victim was manic bi-polar and he just received a Dear John letter from his girlfriend. It was Officer [REDACTED] who relied on his CIT training and experience that allowed us, with limited information, to get the untrusting victim to relinquish his weapon without incident and to patiently talk with the victim to allow medics to treat him and eventually go with officers to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.

I just wanted to acknowledge Officer [REDACTED] invaluable contribution.





During the past 4 years Officer [REDACTED] participated and contributed to the execution of 78 search warrants that led to the seizure of large amounts of marijuana, cocaine, heroin, and cash. The multiple investigations led to the conviction of these cases in both State and Federal Courts for narcotics violations and business robberies that occurred in the township. In August of 2010, Officer [REDACTED] conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with suspect Justin Patterson. Officer [REDACTED] located a large amount of oxycodone inside of the vehicle and contacted Franklin County SIU. Mr. Patterson agreed to work with the Sheriff's Office and introduce us to his supplier's. I'm just giving you an update of the targets that Mr. Patterson has given us to date from this traffic stop. So far, two of the cases have gone federal and have involved over 20 arrests. In these cases we have shut down 3 clinics, including one in Kentucky. Mr. Patterson has given us 8 other suppliers selling cocaine, marijuana, ecstasy, and prescription pills. I have executed 7 search warrants. At one of the residence, the suspect was WUD, and we recovered 53 firearms from the residence. Mr. Patterson is still working with the Sheriff's Office and has lots of other targets. 



On Tuesday, September 22, 2009, at approximately 8:00PM, you became aware that a carjacking with shots fired had just occurred at a Meijer store located at 5555 Cleveland Ave., Columbus, Ohio. Through radio transmissions you were advised that the suspect vehicle was traveling southbound on Cleveland Avenue towards the Northern Lights Shopping Center. You immediately made a decision to cover Walford Rd. north of this shopping center. You observed a vehicle matching the description of the suspect vehicle. You initiated a traffic stop near the Long John Silvers restaurant at this shopping center. You were assisted by Lt. Mike Jones and Officer Keith Bales.

The suspect, later identified as Frankie D. Mosley, DOB: 10-1-1988, did not comply and fled from you. He fired a gun shot at Officer Bales. You and your fellow officers then pursued this suspect as he continued to fire at officers as he tried to flee the area.

Eventually the pursuit concluded at the intersection of Cleveland Avenue and Hudson Avenue. You observed this fugitive attempt to car jack another vehicle after he crashed the vehicle he was driving. You encountered this fugitive who violently resisted you and your fellow officers' efforts in apprehending him. Unfortunately you were injured as a direct result of this individual biting you on your upper left arm.

Mosley has prior felony convictions for carrying a concealed weapon and aggravated robbery. Prior to your encounter with him, he was wanted for robbery and kidnapping which occurred from August 10 -22, 2009 on S. Champion Ave., Columbus, OH. He was also identified as a suspect in an armed robbery and felonious assault which took place on September 4, 2009 on Kenmore Avenue. During this second incident the victim was shot in the back of the head. This victim survived the gunshot wound.

Even though your personal safety was at great risk, you continued your pursuit of this suspect while he was firing his handgun at responding police officers. Your action in this very dangerous situation brings credit to this police department. The citizens of Clinton Township should be as proud of you as I am.






I would like to take this opportunity to praise one of your officers. On 09-16-07 Clinton Township officers were dispatched to Dunbar Ave, on reports of a man out in the street firing a pistol. Officer [REDACTED] was one of the first responders to the scene and quickly took control of the situation. He effectively directed backup officers from several different agencies into the area, securing a perimeter around the apartment building the suspect had fled into. He quickly ascertained the situation and began attempting to talk to the suspect via his car loudspeaker. Within a short amount of time it appeared the suspect was not going to respond to these actions, and Officer [REDACTED] requested more units be dispatched to establish a larger perimeter, in the event SWAT and or negotiators were needed.

I responded to the scene in several capacities. First was as the county supervisor on duty, and secondly as a trained negotiator. My first responsibilities were to evaluate the perimeter and to gather as much information as possible to determine a course of action. Once I arrived I began to gather information from Officer [REDACTED] and surveyed his established perimeter. Before any action could be taken or was needed in my part the suspect responded to Officer [REDACTED] and exited the apartment without further incident.

Having been the relief patrol supervisor for the Franklin County Sheriffs Office for the past few years I am aware that Officer [REDACTED] is used as an OIC several days a week. It should be comforting for you to know he is more than capable of fulfilling this role. He displayed solid leadership and decision making skills during this incident. This is not the first time I have observed this officer conduct himself in such an exemplary manor and I feel remiss I didn't bring his actions to your attention sooner.







According to Rule 109:2-1-12(D) of the Ohio Administrative Code, persons who have previously been certified by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission and have had a break in peace officer service for less than one year may be re-appointed as a peace officer, but must complete any specialized training that has been mandated for re-appointed officers. In the case of the above-referenced individual, no such training mandates apply. Accordingly, no additional training is required at this time.

Note that this determination is made based upon information and documents submitted by you and the individual in question. Should the information provided prove inaccurate, this determination becomes void.

FIREARMS REQUALIFICATION

Update training evaluation letters furnished by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission, in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code 109:2-1-12, will not address or assign training necessary to comply with requirements for annual firearms requalification. This determination should be made at the local by the appropriate officials of the agency/department.

Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 109:2-13 was promulgated in 1995. It states all persons required to successfully complete a firearms requalification program shall do so once each calendar year beginning January 1, 1995.

House Bill 271, which was effective April 10, 1991, amended the Ohio Revised Code to require that all officers identified in ORC Section 109.801(A)(1) must requalify with all duty weapons they use under the auspices of the agency/department with whom they are affiliated.

ORC Section 109.801(A)(2) indicates that no person listed in ORC Section 109.801(A)(1) shall carry a firearm during the course of his/her duties if they have not complied with the requirement for annual firearms requalification in a program approved by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission.

Mission Statement of the Clinton Township Police Department

The Clinton Township Police Department is committed to the prevention of crime and the protection of life and property; the preservation of peace, order and safety; the enforcement of laws and ordinances, and the safeguarding of constitutional guarantees. We nurture public trust by holding ourselves to the highest standards of performance and ethics.

Please tell us what happened - It was Tim and I was driving from greenwich apartment and came to a stop at an intersection at cleveland avenue with my left turn signal on waiting for traffic to clear at both sides and I made my turn to the left of two drive lanes travelling to morse road. Traffic was clear at both sides and I made my turn to the left of two drive lanes travelling to morse road with the speed limit been 35mph but I was driving 15-30mph because I just made a turn to join travelling traffic and was approaching stop traffic in few meters as my car was now gaining speed. For all I know, there was this van travelling with speed just from the pass of traffic light, exited from his drive or travel lane to the narrow lane and was heading towards my lane. I saw him from a short distance, did applied my breaks so hard to stop but he was closer and did hit my car on a crash at the edge of my travel lane with the full body of my car still in my lane. My left head light and fender got wrecked with explosion of all my airbags due to his speed during the crash. A female driver passing by ask if she should call ambulance for me and I said yes, she did and left the scene. In few minutes time a police officer came into the scene ask of my drivers license license, where I was going and I said Morse road and then did put me and my step son at the back of his car without any reason.

What was improper about the officers actions if this a complaint? (The officer neglected me due to my accent in speaking, the officer did not let me talk to the driver who crash my car, the officer made a full statement against me by listening to the driver who crash my car. The officer did not let me explain myself but did kept me and my step son in his car while he was bleeding from nose and mouth, the officer did not ask proof of insurance at the scene but he said I dont have none, the officer gave me ticket for someone crashing my car in my drive lane just from traffic light with pavement along side of road with no exit to turn to. The officer made a willful statement without my right and concern.)






