APPROVAL — CONTRACT FOR STADIUM AT BOWLING GREEN STATE UNIVERSITY, BOWLING GREEN, OHIO, \$3,777.00—WIGGINS & GILLESPIE, BOWLING GREEN, OHIO, CONTRACTOR.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, January 27, 1937.

HON. CARL G. WAHL, *Superintendent of Public Works, Columbus, Ohio.*

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works by Carl G. Wahl, Superintendent, and Wiggins & Gillespie of Bowling Green, Ohio, for the plumbing and sewer contract for the Stadium at Bowling Green State University, Bowling Green, Ohio, which contract calls for the expenditure of three thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven dollars (\$3,777.00). You have also submitted other necessary papers in this connection.

Each copy of the contract contains a certificate of the President of Bowling Green State University that the necessary funds are available for the payment of the University's portion of the contracts for the stadium, the remainder of the funds to be furnished from the P.W.A., Docket No. OH-1389-D. The proof of publication of the notice to bidders, the certificate of the Industrial Commission of Ohio that the lowest bidder has properly complied with the law of Ohio with regard to workmen's compensation, the form of proposal of the lowest bidder, the bond of the American Surety Company of New York, with the power of attorney and its financial statement, and the certificate of the Division of Insurance that the surety has properly complied with the insurance laws and is qualified to transact the business of fidelity and surety insurance in Ohio, are all found in proper legal form.

The letter of the State Architect and Engineer to the Board of Trustees of the University recommending the acceptance of this contract and the letter of the Board of Trustees directing the State Architect and Engineer to enter into this contract, the final approval of the contract by the P.W.A. Director, and the certificate of the Auditor of State that the necessary and proper papers are filed with the Auditor of State are also submitted.

Finding said contract and bond in the proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon, and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.

APPROVAL—CONTRACT FOR REMODELING OF NORTH DORMITORY, MIAMI UNIVERSITY, OXFORD, OHIO, \$6,275.00—EASTERN PLUMBING COMPANY, COLUMBUS, OHIO, CONTRACTOR.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works by Carl G. Wahl, Superintendent, and the Eastern Plumbing Company of Columbus, Ohio, for the heating and ventilating contract for the remodeling of the north dormitory, Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, which contract calls for a total expenditure of six thousand two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$6,275.00). You have also submitted other necessary papers in this connection.

Each contract contains a certificate of the Board of Trustees of Miami University that the money required to meet the University's portion of this contract has been appropriated by the Board of Trustees of Miami University for the construction of this project and is not available for any other purpose. The proof of publication of notice to bidders and the certificate of compliance of the lowest bidder with the laws of Ohio with regard to workmen's compensation, the form of proposal, the contract bond with the Globe Indemnity Company, as surety, the power of attorney for the signer, its financial statement, the certificate of compliance by the surety company with the law of Ohio for insurance companies, and the authorization of the surety to transact the business of fidelity and surety insurance in Ohio, are all found in the proper legal form.

The letter of the State Architect and Engineer to the Board of Trustees of Miami University recommending the acceptance of this contract and the letter of the Board of Trustees directing the Superin-
