Since the purchase of these bonds the village council has amended its bond ordinance so that the bonds now fall due in installments as follows: 1 installment of \$824 on May 1, 1924, 1 installment of \$800 on May 1, 1925 and 1 installment of \$1,600 on May 1st of each of the years 1926 to 1932, inclusive. The resolution of purchase should be amended to show the change in denomination and maturity.
