DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Adjustant General of Ohio, and H. Longenecker and Charles J. Herr, partners doing business under the name of the Longenecker Construction Company, of Greenville, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of State Armory Building, at Ravenna, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of \$49,540.00.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract.
