**Narrative:**

On the morning of December 29, 2020, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) James Gore contacted the residents of 1057 Oberlin Drive, George and Terry Skulski, to follow up on a tip received regarding a suspicious vehicle they observed in the early morning hours of December 22, 2020. The tip that was forwarded to SA Gore was from Terry Skulski, who claimed a white, Jeep-like vehicle with a rumbling muffler left the scene.

Upon greeting the couple, they both stated that there was a vehicle parked on the roadway in front of their neighbor's house to the east at approximately 0115 hours when George was outside with his dog. George said he later pointed the vehicle out to Terry. They described the vehicle as large, with a box-like shape, similar to a Jeep, with a loud exhaust which sounded like a glass-pack muffler. The couple insisted that it was likely this vehicle that their neighbor at 1054 Oberlin Drive complained about, not Andre Hill's grey SUV which was parked further west. The Skulski's said they felt obligated to clarify this because they believed that news reports were incorrect in reporting that Hill's vehicle was the object of their neighbor Bob's (1054 Oberlin) complaint to police.

According to the Skulski's, they heard the vehicle start up, and it sounded as if it drove back west toward Kenny Road when it departed the area. Neither one had seen the vehicle prior to December 22nd. Mr. and Mrs. Skulski agreed to contact investigators if the vehicle returned to the area. Mr. Skulski said he previously relayed the information to another agent on the morning of the incident. SA Gore deduced that it was likely SA Rick Ward.
