## OPOTA'S MOBILE ACADEMY

The Attorney General's Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) is revolutionizing its approach to advanced training. With state-of-the-art firearms and driving simulators and expert instructors, OPOTA's Mobile Academy takes training directly to local law enforcement. Most courses are available at no cost to local agencies.

### Instruction Options

- **Firearms and Use-of-Force Training:** The Mobile Academy's three MILO Range Pro simulators can be set up in minutes within local facilities. They feature more than 425 scenarios, scenario-authoring software, and a library of firearms drills and exercises.
- **Driving Courses:** Three PatrolSim driving simulators feature programmable dashboards that replicate those of all popular cruisers. Instructors use provided scenarios or build their own to help officers improve decision-making during traffic stops, pursuits, emergency responses, and vehicle handling. The simulators are housed in comfortable, climate-controlled trailers, allowing instruction to take place near local facilities.
- **Subject Control Update Training:** This two-day course teaches instructors the most up-to-date concepts in use of force, takedowns, weapons retention, and curriculum development and design.
- **Regional Courses:** The Mobile Academy provides half- and full-day trainings at large, convenient venues throughout Ohio. Courses cover a wide range of topics important to today's peace officers.

# ADDITIONAL TRAINING OPTIONS

- **Classroom Instruction:** Hundreds of courses are available at OPOTA's main campus and tactical training center in London, Ohio, and a satellite campus in Richfield, Ohio. The main campus features a 1.8-mile driving track, indoor and outdoor firing ranges, a scenario house for realistic training exercises, double rooms for overnight stays, and a fitness center.
- **eOPOTA:** More than 70 courses are offered through this Web-based training option, which is available free of charge and around the clock. Through eOPOTA, agencies can eliminate travel costs and accommodate busy department schedules.
- **Law Enforcement Conference:** About 30 workshops are offered at this educational conference, held each fall in central Ohio. The conference draws several hundred attendees and provides valuable networking opportunities for law enforcement professionals.
