Narrative:

On the afternoon of December 30, 2020, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) James Gore and Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Kevin Barbeau interviewed Upper Arlington Fire Paramedic Paul Hill at Upper Arlington Fire Station 72, 3861 Reed Road, Upper Arlington, OH, 43220. Also present was the Upper Arlington City Attorney, Darren Shulman. The purpose of the interview was to have Paramedic Hill describe his unit's response to the Officer Involved Critical Incident which occurred in the early morning hours of December 22, 2020, at 1062 Oberlin Drive, Columbus.


Mr. Hill reported that on the date in question, he was the in-charge paramedic for his unit (Medic 72) that shift, which meant that it was his responsibility for running the scene(s), which included writing the reports and leading any tasks.

Hill recalled that for the incident on Oberlin, the call came over the radio/intercom as an officer-involved shooting, or other words to that effect. He said there was no distinction as to whether the officer did the shooting or if the officer was shot. Hill also recalled seeing on the ambulance's computer terminal's dispatch data his unit, Medic 72, as well as Medic 19 and Engine 19 (Columbus). He said the next entry read "Scene safe to enter." Hill elaborated, when they (Upper Arlington) responds to calls out of their area, there is very limited information on their computer. In contrast, he said when they respond to Upper Arlington calls, there is usually information on the patient, including name, age, etc.

Hill described the route taken to the scene from Station 72 to Oberlin Drive. He said they drove south on Reed Road, then east on Fishinger, then north on Kenny Road, and then onto Oberlin. Hill estimated that there were more than 40 police cars at and near the scene. Hill said he thought it took the ambulance 2–3 minutes to arrive at Oberlin, and perhaps another 30 seconds to arrive at the scene once turning onto Oberlin from Kenny Road. Hill mentioned

that some police vehicles were moving to clear a path for the ambulance when they arrived on Oberlin. (Note: The map image below is for reference only. The dark blue line depicts the route traveled to the scene.)



Hill said upon arriving, he observed a police officer doing chest compressions on the victim, so that was an indication to him that they'd be working a cardiac arrest. He stated the ambulance parked at the end of the driveway at the scene (1062 Oberlin), facing east. Hill later recalled seeing crime scene tape near the right side of the garage, but stated that it did not obstruct or restrict his access to the victim.

Mr. Hill said he approached the victim and asked a police officer what had transpired; that officer responded that he did not know much because he just arrived. Hill said he then asked the officer tending to the victim how long he had been doing chest compressions. That officer reportedly told him 2 minutes and Hill said he advised him to switch out and get another officer to do compressions.

Hill later explained that he had the officer(s) momentarily pause chest compressions while he checked the carotid pulse of the victim. Hill said the victim had no pulse and his pupils were dilated and non-reactive to light. He further explained that a heart monitor (defibrillator) was applied and the rhythm was asystole (no electrical activity). Hill said he observed what looked like obvious bleeding from the victim's right leg and what he thought was the right side of the victim's chest/abdomen area. Hill also later recalled seeing a cell phone near the victim's feet on the driveway and a set of keys on the ground near the victim's head, but inside of the garage.

Hill said chest compressions continued while an AutoPulse™ (automatic chest compression machine) and cot were retrieved from the ambulance. Hill recalled that was also when Medic

19 from Columbus arrived. Hill said Medic 19 personnel assisted with applying the device. Hill also mentioned that he had an officer remove handcuffs from the victim so they could position him on the the AutoPulse TM . After the victim was placed on the cot, Hill said, he was immediately placed in the back of the ambulance for transport to the hospital.

Hill explained that one of the Columbus medics attempted an intraosseous (IO) injection for the administration of infusible medications directly into a leg bone (bone marrow), but failed. Hill reported that the second Columbus medic was successful at starting an intravenous (IV) application site in the victim's right arm, though no medications were administered because by that time the ambulance arrived at the hospital (Riverside Methodist). Hill explained that it would have been their protocol for asystole to administer epinephrine. Hill did not know the names of either of the Columbus medics or the Columbus police officer who rode with them to the hospital.

Hill said he was unsure which direction they traveled to get to the hospital because he was in the back. He knew that the driver, his partner Kenneth Packard, initially backed up from the scene. He assumed that Packard drove north on Kenny, then east on North Broadway to arrive at Riverside Hospital, and he estimated the trip was about 2 minutes. Hill explained that while traveling to the hospital, he called ahead and advised that they had a shooting victim in asystole. He could not provide an age or name to the hospital because he did not have that information at the time.

Hill mentioned that when the ambulance arrived at the hospital, he entered and provided a verbal report to the in-charge doctor in the emergency department, while Packard and the Columbus medics brought the victim into the trauma bay. Hill said the hospital staff assumed patient care for the victim. Among the things Hill recalled observing were continued chest compressions and the use of an ultrasound device to check for heart activity. Hill estimated that care was terminated by the emergency department staff within 5-10 minutes, as the doctor declared the victim deceased.

Mr. Hill reported that he has been a paramedic with Upper Arlington for 3 years and prior to that he was employed with Jefferson Township (Blacklick) for 6 months as a firefighter and emergency medical technician (EMT). Hill said he received his firefighter, EMT, and paramedic training through Columbus State Community College.

SAS Barbeau provided Hill a copy of the Patient Care Report he completed so that he could review it. Mr. Hill reviewed the report and he concurred that there was no new information to add. Copies of the Patient Care Report and related documents were attached to this report for reference.
