## APPROVAL, SEVEN GAME REFUGE LEASES—DISAPPROVAL, THREE.

I have found the above leases, with the exception of Leases Nos. 2049, 2050 and 2051 to be in proper legal form, and have endorsed my approval on same.

With respect to the leases above excepted, there is no authority for the Director of Public Welfare to lease state lands for Game Refuge purposes. Section 1435, General Code, provides in part as follows:

"The conservation council may for a specified period of years prohibit or recall the taking of birds, fish and wild animals, upon public lands or water set aside, with the consent and approval of the governor, or upon private lands set aside with the consent of the owner thereof, for game refuges. \* \* \* " (Italics the writer's.)

It may thus be seen that the lands to be leased under leases 2049, 2050 and 2051 are public lands (Cleveland State Hospital) and consequently can be set aside as game refuges only with the Governor's consent.

I am returning all of the leases submitted, herewith.
