Narrative:

On Monday, November 11, 2024, at approximately 2200 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Cory Momchilov (Momchilov) was notified of an officer-involved critical incident that occurred in the area of 5050 Eastpointe Drive, Medina.

SA Momchilov was further informed that the shooting stemmed from an incident in Jefferson County, Ohio. Reportedly, an individual named Charles Alexander (Alexander), abducted his 7-year old daughter and an Amber Alert was issued. Alexander was the non-custodial parent of his daughter.

Alexander and his daughter were later located in Medina County. Law Enforcement encountered Alexander in a U-Haul box truck type vehicle, where he reportedly held his daughter hostage. A standoff ensued and at some point, [REDACTED] with the Ohio State Highway [REDACTED] shot Alexander. Alexander's daughter was unharmed during the shooting.

At approximately 2258 hours, SA Momchilov arrived on scene and made contact with SA William Conn. SA Conn informed SA Momchilov that the Ohio State Highway Patrol Trooper who was involved in the incident was currently at the Medina Post of the Ohio State Highway Patrol. SA Momchilov was further informed that the trooper was positioned on the Interstate 71 southbound exit ramp to State Route 18 when he fired.

SA Momchilov then traveled to the Medina Post where he was informed that [REDACTED] had fired his weapon during the incident. SA Momchilov was also led into a room where multiple Ohio State Highway Patrol SRT members were. SA Momchilov asked if any SRT members witnessed the shooting. All the SRT members stated they did not witness the shooting and that the majority of SRT members had not yet arrived on scene at the time of the shooting.

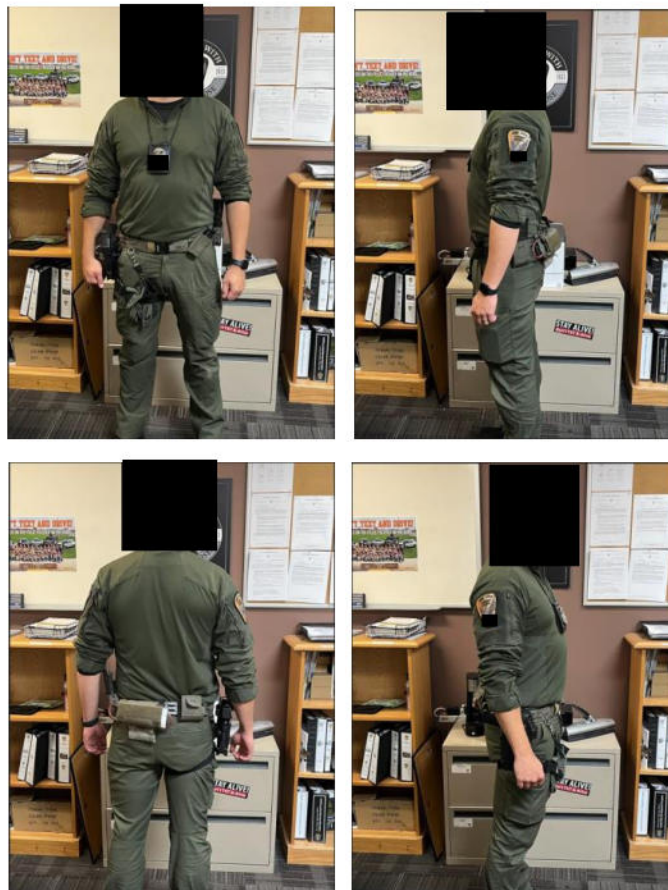

SA Momchilov then made contact with [REDACTED] and stated that BCI was requested to conduct the investigation of the shooting.

[REDACTED] confirmed that he fired one round from a sniper rifle and that he was on the top of his vehicle when he fired. [REDACTED] further stated that his rifle was left at the scene.

SA Momchilov asked [REDACTED] if he wished to provide a statement. [REDACTED] stated that he did not and that he was being represented by Attorney Nichole Wannemacher.

SA Momchilov then photographed [REDACTED] in the clothing he was wearing at the time of the incident.

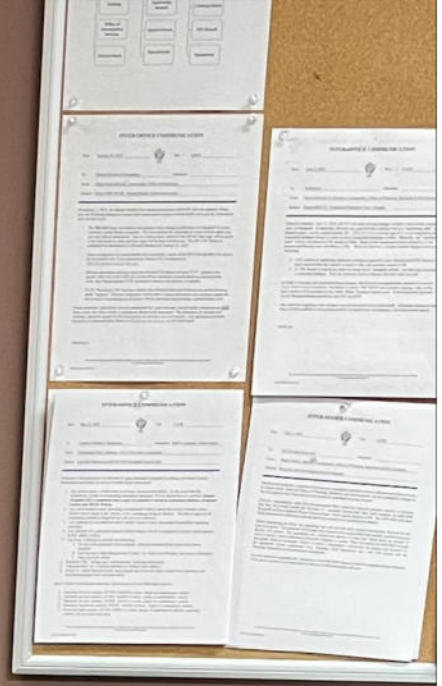
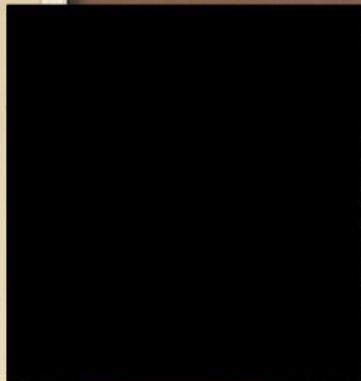
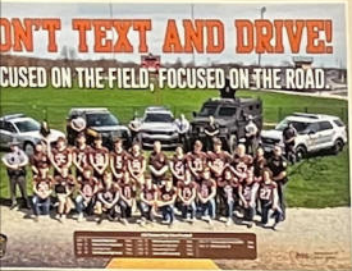
