Narrative:

On Wednesday, January 21, 2026, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agents (SA) Jared Prill, SA Thomas Verhiley and SA Jessie Bynum conducted a neighborhood canvass in the area of 24496 Clareshire Drive, North Olmsted, Ohio. The purpose for the canvass was to identify and interview potential witnesses to the officer-involved critical incident that occurred at 24496 Clareshire Drive, North Olmsted, Ohio on Wednesday, January 21, 2026. During the neighborhood canvass, Special Agents Prill, Verhiley and Bynum made or attempted contact with the residents at the following locations:

24496 Clareshire Drive, Apt. K

At approximately 1834 hours, SA Prill and SA Verhiley spoke with Tracy Lehané (Lehané). It was explained to Lehané that the Ohio Bureau of Criminal investigation was requested to conduct an independent investigation of an officer involved shooting that had occurred in the apartment complex and was looking for potential witnesses to the offense. Lehané stated that at the time of the shooting she was asleep and did not hear anything related to the incident, but that her seventeen-year-old daughter, Maizy Plank (Plank), had told her that she heard approximately four shots and watched an individual being transported on a stretcher afterwards. Lehané stated that the Blink camera system was not working at the time of the incident and provided a contact number of [REDACTED] if any additional information is needed from investigators.

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4850 Columbia Road

At approximately 1842 hours, SA Prill and SA Verhiley contacted Peggy Hart (Hart). Hart advised investigators that she heard the accident of the suspect's vehicle at the intersection of Columbia and Brook Park Road and saw officers approaching the car with their guns drawn. At that time Hart decided that she should go back inside her residence and did not witness any other details from the incident. Hart stated that she had no cameras on the outside of her residence and provided the contact number of [REDACTED] for any additional questions.

24510 Clareshire Drive, Apt. A and Apt. B

At approximately 1850 hours, SA Prill and SA Verhiley attempted to make contact at 24510 Clareshire Drive Units A & B, but no one came to the door of these apartments.

24466 Clareshire Drive, Apt C

At approximately 2004 hours, SA Prill and SA Verhiley conducted an interview with James Bob (Bob). Bob advised that he heard the initial siren that made Bob believe someone was getting pulled over. The sirens heard were on Clareshire Drive, close to Bob's residence. When sirens got close to Bob's house he heard two suspected gun shots. At that time, Bob looked out the window of his apartment, and he saw the suspect run across towards the female homeowner across the street, who Bob heard screaming and believed the suspect was attempting to barricade himself inside her apartment. At that time, Bob stated that he heard approximately four additional shots after the first two. There was a total of approximately six or seven shots fired. Bob provided the SA Prill and SA Verhiley with a phone number [REDACTED] for any future follow-up and stated there were no cameras on his residence.

24496 Clareshire Drive, Apt. G

While SA Prill and SA Verhiley were conducting their neighborhood canvass, SA Bynum was also attempting to talk with neighboring residents. SA Bynum went to 24496 Clareshire Drive, Apt G and spoke with Amy Bunch (Bunch). Bunch was not present at the time of the incident and had no cameras on her residence. Bunch provided the phone number of [REDACTED] for any additional follow-up.

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24466 Clareshire Drive, Apt. I

SA Bynum went to 24466 Clareshire Drive, Apt I and spoke with Morina Alqurneh (Alqurneh). Alqurneh has a camera system on the exterior of their residence, but it did not capture the incident due to motion recording. Alqurneh's phone number is [REDACTED]

24466 Clareshire Drive, Apt. J

SA Prill, SA Verhiley and SA Bynum spoke with Joel Alsouss (Alsouss) at 24466 Clareshire Drive, Apt J. Alsouss was not home at time of the incident but had a home security camera system and was able to provide SA Bynum with the captured footage from the time during the incident. Alsouss provided the contact number of [REDACTED] in case any additional information is needed.

SA Prill and SA Verhiley recorded the interviews they conducted via body camera during the process except for the interview conducted with Joel Alsouss. The recordings are stored in an Axon Justice folder labeled Reference Item D - Interviews in a subfolder labeled BCI Neighborhood Canvass.
