

The following questions pertaining to crash 12-0580-12 on Sunday, June 13, 2021, were asked to Officer Amanda Rosales on Monday June 21, 2021. Officer Rosales had her attorney, Brad Barbin, present at the time of questioning. Officer Rosales was also read her Miranda Rights and signed off on those rights under the direction of her attorney.

1. Were you on duty at the time of the incident?
A. YES
2. Were you wearing the uniform of the day at the time of the incident?
A. YES
3. Were you operating a city vehicle (police cruiser) at the time of the crash? What was the make/model?
A. YES, Ford Explorer
4. Was there anything affecting or obscuring your view while operating your police vehicle?
A. NO
5. Where is your radar unit located on your vehicle?
A. My vehicle does not have a radar unit
6. Had you been dispatched to a call for service? What was that call?
A. Tones were dropped, so that is all units available. So, they did not call my unit specifically, but I keyed up and said I was enroute.
7. Were you distracted by anything outside your Vehicle?
A. NO
 - a. Any oncoming traffic?
A. NO
 - b. Any other responding officers?
A. NO
 - c. Anyone trying to get your attention?
A. NO
8. Were you distracted by anything inside your vehicle?
A. NO
 - a. Were you operating you in car computer?
A. NO
 - b. Were you talking on the radio?
A. NO
 - c. Were you manipulating your spot light?
A. NO
 - d. Were you manipulating your emergency lights or siren?
A. They were already on, so no.

9. Do you take any medications? If so, did you take said medication as prescribed?
A. NO
10. What shift (hours) did you work on Sunday, June 13, 2021?
A. 2300-0700, but I clocked out at 0300.
11. How much sleep did you get prior to the start of your shift?
A. 8+ hours
12. Do you know at what speed you were traveling when the crash occurred?
A. NO, I wasn't going fast though
13. What vehicle were you driving at the time of the crash?
A. Car #70, Ford Explorer
14. Did you have your headlights on at the time of the crash?
A. YES
15. Were both headlights working at the time of the crash?
A. YES
16. Approximately how far ahead of your vehicle did you headlights illuminate?
A. I honestly do not know.
17. Did you have any additional lighting on your vehicle at the time of the crash?
A. Headlights and Emergency Lights
18. Are you familiar with the area of the crash?
A. Not really
- a. Are you familiar with house/block numbers?
A. Familiar with the house numbers and how to find them, with regards to which side of the street.
- b. What address or addresses were you looking for?
A. To begin with: 1047 S. Center original address we were dispatched to. The dispatcher then rereadvised the address 41407 S. Center Blv., I then keyed up and asked if she could readvise the address, she came back with 411L and then nothing else. Which I immediately realized was not a good address, I then pulled over to the side of the road on S. Center, turned sirens off, then asked dispatch to readvise the address. Once she gave me the 1407 address I reactivated my sirens and continued south on S. Center. Another thing I heard by another officer was the 1407 S. Center address.
- c. Which side of the street were you looking at the time of the crash?
A. The west side

19. Are you familiar with the area leading up to the crash?
A. **A majority of it.**
20. Was the area lighted?
A. **Not well**
a. Were the streets clearly marked?
A. **YES, as much as they can be.**
21. Did you see anyone in the roadway?
A. **NO**
22. Did you see anyone on the sidewalks or the grass median?
A. **NO**
23. Did you receive any information about the location of the individual prior to the crash?
A. **NO**
24. Did you realize you hit something? If so, when did you realize that you hit something?
A. **YES, I realized immediately, as soon as I felt it.**
25. Did you know what you hit when the crash happened?
A. **NO**
26. What did you do immediately after you realized you hit something?
A. **I got out of my vehicle and rendered aid.**
27. How would you describe your mental, emotional condition prior to the crash?
A. **I was fine.**
a. Were you feeling sick, tired, fatigued?
A. **NO**
b. Were you excited, anxious, nervous?
A. **Not any more than usual**
28. Did you consume any alcoholic beverages prior to the crash?
A. **NO**
29. Did you take/consume any illegal substances prior to the crash?
A. **NO**
30. Did you have your seatbelt on at the time of the crash?
A. **NO**
31. Were you injured as a result of the crash?

A. Not physically, emotionally seeing what I saw, "that is horrible."

32. Did you see anyone lying in the roadway?

A. NO

33. Did you see what the pedestrian lying in the roadway was wearing?

A. Obviously not prior, because I did not see him in the roadway, but I saw what he was wearing immediately after, while rendering aid.

34. Do you feel you were using due regard while you were in emergency response?

A. YES

35. Do you feel you operated your vehicle in a negligent or reckless manner?

A. NO

36. Did at any time, anyone advise you that anyone was in the roadway?

A. NO

37. Did you hear anyone advise you that the shooting victim was in the roadway?

A. NO. At no point did dispatch advise his location other than the address.

38. Just prior to the crash what were you doing inside the vehicle, where were you looking?

A. I was looking to the west for that specific house number, I was not sent the call on my in car computer, thus I did not have my cross streets.

39. How many different addresses were you given?

A. At the time, I recall 3 addresses. 2 incorrect and 1 correct.

40. Did you have a rear in car camera in the vehicle, which was working?

A. Yes, I don't know. I didn't have anyone in the back.

On June 24, 2021, Sergeant B. Schmutz was informed by Mr. Barbin, Officer Rosales' attorney, that she does not have any correct lenses as stated on her driver license.
