Narrative:

On October 19, 2024, relative to the Officer-Involved Critical Incident that occurred earlier that day in Dayton, Ohio. Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent Dave Hornyak identified contacted officers from the Oakwood, Perry Twp. and Englewood Police Departments who were reported to have been at the scene. The following information was obtained:

- Perry Twp. PD – Chief Erica Barga advised that PTPD Officer Dakota Cox was at the scene and heard the shooting, but did not see it. Chief Barga advised that as Officer Cox had no other involvement, he would not be completing an incident report.
- Englewood PD – EPD Dispatch reported to BCI that the responding unit was Englewood 212; the officer was later identified as Officer Jacob Ullmer. On October 21, 2024, via telephone, Officer Ullmer advised BCI that he and a Perry Twp. officer were approximately 1 1/2 blocks away from the location of the subject vehicle when the shooting occurred and they did not see, but only heard the shots being fired. Officer Ullmer stated that he and the other officer ran up to the vehicle after the shooting and were asked to put up crime scene tape. He did not see any impropriety on the part of any law enforcement officers.
- Oakwood PD – Public Safety Officer Rob Wilson was identified as the responding officer. When it was learned that Officer Wilson directly assisted in providing initial medical care to the subject, a phone interview was conducted as noted in a separate Investigative Report documented within this case file.
