Narrative:

On Tuesday, January 20, 2026, at 1743 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Joshua Welty (SA Welty) and SA Chad Holcomb (SA Holcomb) interviewed Ashville Police Department (APD) Officer (Ofc.) Priscilla Ide (Ide). The interview took place at 4800 Duvall Road, Ashville, Ohio. The interview was audio recorded.

Ofc. Ide was identified as being a police officer who witnessed and/or had some level of involvement in the January 20, 2026 officer-involved shooting which occurred around 4800 Duvall Road, Lot 303, Ashville, Ohio. Reportedly, Ofc. Ide did not discharge a firearm during the incident. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information of the incident known or observed by this officer.

Ofc. Ide stated her radio call sign on January 20, 2026, was 6817. She has been employed by the APD for about 6 months. She has been a police officer for a total of 2 years. During the incident, Ofc. Ide wore her standard police uniform with a metal police badge affixed to it. She also wore an external ballistic vest and duty belt. She was wearing a body worn camera (BWC), and it was activated during the incident.

Ofc. Ide stated the initial dispatch for the call at the Duvall Road location was a rape. The male, later identified as Chase Dalton (Dalton), was still on scene and the female, later identified as [REDACTED] had locked herself in a bedroom. Two other officers had responded to the initial dispatch, and she remained in the village. Once she heard the other officers had Dalton at gunpoint, she responded.

Upon her arrival, Ofc. Ide observed officers to have Dalton at gunpoint. She was at a further distance away in comparison to the other officers, so she did not hear what was being said. Ofc. Ide did see Dalton on the porch and saw him with a gun in his hand. She learned through radio traffic that the caller, [REDACTED], was still inside the home and that officers should try to make entry through the back door.

Ofc. Ide, accompanied by Deputy Arnold, made their way to the rear door of the home. While there, Ofc. Ide explained a male had come running towards the scene, and possibly the sheriff [Hafey], had stopped the male. She explained they continued their attempt at contacting [REDACTED] by knocking on the windows and doors. As Ofc. Ide was at the rear of the trailer; she heard the gunshots. Ofc. Ide did not know how many gunshots she heard.

After hearing the gunshots, Ofc. Ide made her way to the opposite side of the trailer. She then observed Dalton on the ground and officers near him. She explained Dalton was not speaking.

Ofc. Ide did not know who Dalton was at the time of the incident. She was not injured during the incident. She has had no prior contact with Chase Dalton and did not discharge her firearm.

The interview concluded at approximately 1749 hours.
