AGREEMENT—SUPPLEMENTAL, STATE WITH NORFOLK
AND WESTERN RAILWAY COMPANY, ELIMINATION
GRADE CROSSING OVER TRACKS, STATE HIGHWAY No.
41, VILLAGE OF BATAVIA, CLERMONT COUNTY.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted supplemental agreement in duplicate between yourself, as Director of Highways, and the Norfolk and Western Railway Company covering the matter of the elimination of the grade crossing over the tracks of the Norfolk and Western Railroad Company on State Highway No. 41, located at a point in Clermont County, Ohio, in the Village of Batavia.
