- Employee ID numbers- 149.433 (2) and (3). Employee ID numbers are not public record, pursuant to R.C. 149.433 (2) and (3).
- LE firearm Serial Number- Law enforcement firearm serial number, pursuant to R.C. 149.433
- Security and infrastructure records – redacted pursuant to R.C. 149.433.
- All officers work shifts- R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(uu), Records of the past, current, and future work schedule of a designated public service worker. As used in division (A)(1)(tt) of this section, ‘work schedule’ does not include the docket of cases of a court, judge, or magistrate.
- Officer name- Confidential Law Enforcement Investigatory Records (CLEIRS), pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(2)(a)-(d) Records pertain to a law enforcement matter and disclosure would create a high probability of revealing: The identity of an uncharged suspect, R.C. 149.43(A)(2)(a)
- SSN-149.43(A)(1)(dd) 149.45(A)(1)(a)- *State ex rel. Office of Montgomery County Pub. Defender v. Siroki*, 108 Ohio St.3d 207, 842 N.E.2d 508, 2006-Ohio-662, ¶ 18; R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd); and R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(a).
- Driver’s license number-R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(C)18 U.S.C. § 2741, Driver’s license numbers are considered personal information, exempt from disclosure, pursuant to R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(c), and are further protected from disclosure by the Driver’s Privacy Protection Act of 1994. 18 U.S.C. § 2741.
- OHLEG photos documents and audits- Information, data, and statistics obtained from the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG) database, pursuant to 109.57(D)(1)(b)
- CCH- Information from the Computerized Criminal History (CCH) National Crime Information Center (NCIC) systems, pursuant to R.C. 109.57 and O.A.C. 4501:2-10-06(C)
- ATF Records- ATF Trace Reports, pursuant to Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2005, Pub. L. No. 108-477, 118 Stat. 2809, 2859 (2004); Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008, Pub. L. No. 110-161, 121 Stat. 2859 (2004); and *Higgins v. U.S. Dept. of Justice*, 919 F. Supp.2d 131, 144-45 (D.D.C. 2013)
- Other names not related to request- R.C. 149.43- Names, Identities or documents that are not responsive to your request, as they may also contain information otherwise exempt from release under R.C. 149.43.
- Telephone number of witnesses- Telephone numbers of victims or witnesses to a crime that are listed on a law enforcement record or report, pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(mm)
- Account numbers- R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd) & 149.45(A)(1)(d), Financial Account Numbers (including bank and credit card account numbers) Pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd) and R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(d)
- Medical Records- 149.43(A)(1)(a). Information obtained from medical records redacted. R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a).
- Phone number- Residential and familial information of designated public service workers pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(p) and R.C. 149.43(A)(7)-(8)
- Private Parts and Victim at scene of death - Ohio R.C.149.43 (A)(1)(ii) Any depiction by photograph, film, videotape, or printed or digital image under either of the following circumstances: (i) The depiction is that of a victim of an offense the release of which would be, to a reasonable person of ordinary sensibilities, an offensive and objectionable intrusion into the victim's expectation of bodily privacy and integrity.
- Nudity - A person's nude body, unless, subject to division (H)(1) of this section, the person's consent has been obtained RC 149.43 (h)

- Victim's Rights O.R.C. 149.43 (A)(1)(rr) records, documents, and information the release of which is prohibited under sections 2930.04 and 2930.07. Crime victims are provided certain rights detailed in the Ohio Constitution Article I, Section 10(a) and the Ohio Revised Code, often called “Marsy’s Law” or the Ohio Crime Victims’ Bill of Rights.
- EMS Run Report - Patient’s medical history, diagnosis, prognosis, and medical condition are redacted. Non-medical personal information does not fall under “medical records” exemption in R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a). See 2001 Ohio Atty.Gen.Ops. No. 041; 1999 Ohio Atty.Gen.Ops. No. 006; *State ex rel. Natl. Broadcasting Co., Inc. v. Cleveland*, 82 Ohio App.3d 202, 214 (8th Dist. 1992).
- Autopsy reports and photographs redacted/withheld - R.C. 313.10(D). A journalist may request to inspect these records, but cannot receive a copy of them.
- SSN-149.43(A)(1)(dd) 149.45(A)(1)(a)- *State ex rel. Office of Montgomery County Pub. Defender v. Siroki*, 108 Ohio St.3d 207, 842 N.E.2d 508, 2006-Ohio-662, ¶ 18; R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd); and R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(a).
- LEADS-Information from the Law Enforcement Agencies Database Systems (LEADS), pursuant to O.A.C. 45-1:2-10-06(c)
- PII (confidential personal information)- Personal information as defined by Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1347 is not a public record pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(v).
- Restricted portions of body-worn camera or dashboard camera recording – redacted pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(jj). Restricted portions include those that disclose the identity of the alleged victim of domestic violence and is restricted pursuant to R.C. 149.43 (A)(17)(j).
