

Narrative:

On Tuesday, September 10, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Nick Valente (Valente) received the personnel file and training records for rom the Cleveland Heights Police Department (CHPD). SA Jon Lieber (Lieber) reviewed the personnel file and training records and noted the following:

Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy/Commission Records


