subject was wearing a Carhartt jacket. He recalled sounding "a bit distressed" on the radio and remembered him saying he had the subject at gunpoint and to send additional police officers. He also remembered saying over the radio, "He's not showing me his hands." As he was getting onto Interstate Route 75 from Glendale Milford Road, he heard "shots fired" over the radio. He confirmed that he did not actually hear the shots being fired due to his siren activation.
arrived on the scene after the shooting event had ended. Upon his arrival, he came into contact with He described He described He described He as being upset when he first observed him at the scene. He demonstrated that He was holding his hands on top of his head and said, "He [involved subject Samuel Munyarutete] just wouldn't stop coming at me."
