**Narrative:**

On December 22, 2020, at approximately 0930 hours, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI), Special Agent (SA) Perry Roeser attempted to contact neighbors of 1062 Oberlin Dr., Columbus, Ohio, to inquire about what they witnessed regarding the shooting incident involving the Columbus Police and Andre Hill.

SA Roeser first went to 1046 Oberlin Dr. and contacted Justin McIntosh, the homeowner. SA Roeser asked Justin if he heard or saw anything in the early morning hours regarding the police activity. Justin explained he was home all night asleep and did not hear or see anything. SA Roeser asked if the home had any surveillance systems, and Justin said no. Justin's phone number was [REDACTED].

SA Roeser then approached 1034 Oberlin Dr. and contacted Alyssa Holiday, the homeowner. SA Roeser asked Alyssa and her husband, Brian, if they heard or saw anything regarding the police activity in the early morning hours. Brian said he thought he heard three gunshots but saw nothing. SA Roeser saw a video doorbell system at the front door. SA Roeser asked Brian if he had reviewed the footage from his security system. Brian said he had, but the sensor was motion-activated, and nothing was recorded overnight. The security doorbell system was named Vivint. The Holidays can be reached at [REDACTED].
