Narrative:

On Monday, February 27, 2023, the investigation regarding the officer-involved shooting that occurred in Mineral City, Ohio, on September 28, 2022, was ruled on and decided by the Tuscarawas County Prosecutor's Office by Tuscarawas County Prosecutor Ryan Styre (Styre). Prosecutor Styre ruled that this matter will not be presented to the grand jury nor will his office pursue any criminal charges regarding the actions of Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office Deputy and Deputy for the death of Everett Martin.

All evidence in this case has been returned to the requesting agency on February 28, 2023, at 1035 hours. Special agent assistance is no longer required by the requesting agency.

The documents received from the Tuscarawas County Prosecutor's Office, along with the signed evidence receipt, are attached to this report. Please refer to those documents for further information.

This case is closed.

Re: BCI Investigation of Officer Involved Critical Incident involving deputies of the Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office; SIU Case No. 2022-2016; BCI Lab No. 22-39390

Special Agent Goudy:

I have had the opportunity to carefully review your investigative reports and supporting evidence of the September 28, 2022 officer-involved shooting of Everett Martin at 5611 E. Third St., Mineral City, Ohio. It is my conclusion that this was a thorough and comprehensive investigation by your agency upon which I can base an informed decision. For the reasons set forth herein, we have determined not to present this matter to the grand jury nor pursue any criminal charges against the officers involved and will be closing our file.

A police officer acts reasonably in using deadly force when the officer has a reasonable belief that the suspect poses an imminent threat of serious physical harm or death to the officer or to others. *Tennessee v. Garner* (1985), 471 U.S. 1, 105 S.Ct. 1694; *Graham v. Connor* (1989), 490 U.S. 386. The Fourth Amendment inquiry is whether the officers' actions are "objectively reasonable" in light of the facts and circumstances confronting them, without regard to their underlying intent or motivation. The "reasonableness" of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, and its calculus must embody an allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force necessary in a particular situation.

The multiple witness interviews, physical and forensic evidence, autopsy and toxicology findings, and other details of your investigation establish that Martin was upset that he was arrested on September 18 and that the Court ordered him to have no

contact with his ex-girlfriend, Courtney Digenova, or the home in which he had previously resided with her. Digenova stated that she arrived home on September 22 to find Martin in the home in violation of the protection order; that he threatened to kill Digenova, her boyfriend, and himself; and that she did not report that violation at the time. On September 28 at 9:25 a.m., Digenova called 911 to report that Martin was at the home knocking on the door. When officers arrived, they encountered Martin who unfortunately had been consuming alcohol and marijuana and was expressing suicidal ideations. Martin indicated he had a knife in his coat pocket, although he would not show it. CIS-trained deputies spent nearly a half hour attempting to deescalate Martin outside the residence. When Martin refused to take his hands out of his pockets and charged at an entry door of the residence, Lt. deployed a less-lethal beanbag round in an attempt to incapacitate Martin and prevent his entry into the home. The beanbag had little effect, and Martin pulled a Taurus 9mm pistol from his person and pointed it at the direction of deputies. He fired one round. Dep. and Dep. each responded to this deadly threat; Dep. fired five rounds from his duty pistol, and Dep. fired two rounds from his duty rifle. When the threat was eliminated, deputies immediately but unsuccessfully applied first aid to Martin.

The TCSO officers in question responded appropriately to this incident. There is no reasonable interpretation of the evidence other than the two officers using lethal force were objectively faced with an imminent threat to the lives of themselves and other officers at the scene before each made the reasonable determination to utilize deadly force. The officers' use of deadly force was justified to confront the deadly threat against the officers present at the scene.

For these reasons, I find that the use of deadly force by Dep. and Dep. was reasonable and justified in each instance. Accordingly, I have determined that there is no basis for the pursuit of any criminal prosecution against any of the officers in connection to this incident and will be closing our file.
