**Narrative:**

On Sunday, March 16, 2025, at 0458 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Eric Lehnhart (SA Lehnhart) interviewed James Aaron Graham (Graham), relative to the officer-involved critical incident which took place on Sunday, March 16, 2025. The interview took place at 220 South Way, Ravenna, Ohio 44266, the Ravenna Police Department. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information about the incident known or observed by this individual.

Graham, who is currently between homes, stated that he was returning to Becky Clark's apartment around 0100 hours, where he sleeps on her couch at night. As he was approaching the building, he heard what he described as four (4) gunshots coming from inside.

Graham walked the remaining 100 feet to the door and was met by a Ravenna police officer who advised him he would not be permitted inside the apartment building for a while.

Graham cooperated with Ravenna officers and detectives on scene, but advised SA Lehnhart that he did not witness the actual shooting.

The interview concluded at approximately 0506 hours.
