Narrative:

On Tuesday, May 20, 2025, at 0317 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Matt Collins (SA Collins) interviewed Columbus Division of Police (CPD) Officer (Ofc.) Grant Hundley (Ofc. Hundley). The interview took place at the CPD SWAT Headquarters. The interview was audio recorded.

Ofc. Hundley was identified as being a police officer who witnessed and/or had some level of involvement in the May 19, 2025 officer-involved shooting which occurred in the area of 4482 Hampton Woods, Ohio. Reportedly, Ofc. Hundley did not discharge a firearm during the course of the incident. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information of the incident known or observed by this officer.

Ofc. Hundley stated his radio call sign on May 19, 2025, was 14. He has been employed by the CPD for about four (4) years. He has been a police officer for a total of four (4) years. During the incident, Ofc. Hundley wore his standard police uniform with a metal police badge affixed to it. He also wore an external ballistic vest and duty belt. He drove CPD unit #R-12, a Ford Explorer, marked with CPD emblems and emergency lights. He advised the vehicle was equipped with an in-car camera and it was activated. Ofc. Hundley was a single man unit. Ofc. Hundley stated his BWC was activated and was dropped off at the scene.

Ofc. Hundley stated he was at first precinct and noticed two separate runs that were in close proximity to each other. Ofc. Hundley stated he'd previously worked in the sixth precinct and believed, given their respective locations, the calls could be in reference to the same incident. A female and male yelling. Third party called and said the male had a firearm and the female could not get to the phone. Ofc. Hundley said sixth precinct and midwatch officers responded to the address. An officer advised, via radio, there was someone shooting at them.

Later, an officer said it was only the subject breaking glass. Ofc. Hundley left the first precinct and responded to the Hampton Woods address. Then an officer, via radio, stated the subject did in fact fire a shot at the officers and the subject was approaching the door with a firearm. Ofc. Hundley stated dispatch had aired a "10-3" for that location.

Ofc. Hundley stated when he arrived in the area, he described officers taking cover behind vehicles as they faced the apartment building. Ofc. Hundley moved up with other officers toward the apartment building. There was an officer who was yelling toward the apartment for the subject to come out. Ofc. Hundley stated he, himself got on the PA and began issuing commands for the subjects to come out, with nothing in their hands. He further stated, he advised it was the Columbus Police and they were not leaving. Ofc. Hundley estimated he made five to six (5-6) announcements as described.

Ofc. Hundley stated the front door "cracked open" but he could not see anyone or anything. However, Ofc. Hundley stated he did hear a single gunshot which he believed to have come from a handgun (based on sound only). This caused Ofc. Hundley to move back into more cover. Ofc. Hundley stated he did not return fire because he could not identify the person who fired the shot and he also knew there was a female bystander inside. Ofc. Hundley stated he and other officers waited for SWAT to arrive. Once SWAT arrived officers were relieved from their forward positions and asked to remain in the area of Sugarbush and Teaton intersection.

Ofc. Hundley stated he later learned the subject's name was Jerry and the female's name was Mary-Beth.

The interview concluded at approximately 0334 hours.
