#### Narrative:

On Wednesday, November 27, 2024, at 0918 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Matthew Armstrong (Armstrong) and SA Nick Valente (Valente) interviewed Canton Police Department (CPD) who was accompanied by his attorney, Ty Graham, from the Fraternal Order of Police. The interview took place at BCI – Richfield located at 4055 Highlander Parkway, Richfield, Ohio 44286. The interview was audio and video recorded.



said the driver of the armored vehicle maneuvered the vehicle through the parking lot of the Rodeway Inn and eventually pushed the subject's vehicle out of the way. During that time, said none of the officers inside the vehicle opened the small ports on the side of the vehicle. These small ports were described 5-6" holes that SWAT officers could use to aim their firearms through. These ports provided a means to operate, but also a point of vulnerability should the subject have fired at the vehicle.
Once the armored vehicle repositioned itself in front of Room #220, said it was difficult to see inside due to the window glare on the large window of Room #220. To solve this issue, one of the OSHP SRT team members inside the armored vehicle began firing less lethal rounds to knock out the window.
The window took some time to break. During that time, was aiming his rifle through the center port of the armored vehicle. As the window slowly broke apart, he was able to see more and more of the interior of Room #220. First, he was able to see a bed with a large mound of blankets and pillows lying on top of it. He then began seeing small amounts of movement that appeared to be a person moving behind the bed.
The OSHP trooper continued to shoot out the window with the less-lethal rounds. Eventually, the entire window was shattered, and could clearly see inside. He noticed the bathroom light on, but did not recall any other lighting inside.
Officers on scene were given the command by Canton Regional SWAT Commander Captain Marino to shoot whenever they had a line of sight.
continued to aim his rifle through the center port of the armored vehicle. He was aiming in the general direction of Room #220. He then saw the left hand of the subject come over the mound of blankets and pillows on the bed pointing a gun in the direction of began firing his rifle in the general area of the bed/mound of blankets and pillows. This was the area where he believed the subject to be based upon the location of the subject's arm and a small portion of his head. After fired his weapon, he recalled announcing it to the other officers inside the armored vehicle. believed he fired his rifle approximately 7-9 times.
Other officers on scene stated that they believed they saw a portion of the subject's body on the ground near the foot of the bed. The SWAT team then began formulating a plan to launch their ground drone to enter the room first. Said the ground drone became stuck, so a few flash bangs were utilized in an effort to gain a





response from the subject. Eventually, the ground drone was able to navigate into the room and confirmed the subject was down on the ground and no longer a threat.
A few members of the Canton SWAT team entered the room to detain the subject and render first aid. remained in the armored vehicle during the entirety of the incident.
feared for his safety and the safety of other officers on scene. Although was behind cover in the armored vehicle, he was still exposed in the area of the open port. He stated, "I was concerned, I was definitely worried I don't know how good of a shot this guy is you can hit a five inch hole pretty far out" [29:00]. He did not learn that another officer had been shot until after the shooting incident occurred.
was unsure how many rounds in total were fired during the incident. He explained that it was difficult to hear from inside the armored vehicle.  also did not provide any commands to the subject prior to firing his weapon. He again explained that any command he could have given would have been muffled by the armored vehicle and would not have been heard by the subject or anyone else on the outside of the vehicle.
had no previous encounters with the subject, nor had he ever responded to the location before. He indicated the Rodeway Inn was not in his normal area of jurisdiction.
The interview concluded at approximately 0955 hours.
