Narrative:

On June 5, 2026, at approximately 0004 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agents Dave Hornyak (SA Hornyak) and Kevin Barkley (SA Barkley) interviewed Officer Mike Veeneman (Ofc. Veeneman) of the West Chester Police Department (WCPD), badge #169, relative to the officer-involved critical incident that occurred several hours earlier in the late evening of June 4, 2026, in West Chester, Ohio.

Ofc. Veeneman was identified as having witnessed and/or had some level of involvement in the incident which occurred at 9093 Zinnia Court, Apt 1209, in West Chester, Ohio. Reportedly, Ofc. Veeneman did not discharge a firearm during the incident. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information of the incident known or observed by this officer.

The interview was recorded on a handheld digital recording device. This report is a summary only. The entire interview can be reviewed on the recording.

Ofc. Veeneman stated that he was voluntarily attending the interview and then provided the following information:

On the evening of June 4, 2026, Ofc. Veeneman was called to Zinnia Court by WCPD [REDACTED] and instructed to respond with his canine, "Max." The response was initiated after a neighbor called 911 to report a domestic dispute with a female having been assaulted.

At the scene, Sgt. Parrett made verbal contact with a male at the subject residence, but the male would not open the door. Officers were able to make both text and verbal contact with the alleged victim via phone. Additional officers on-scene were Ofc. Tyler Marling and Ofc. Brandon Musgrove.

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At some point, officers made forced entry into the residence. Ofc. Veeneman followed the entry team inside and moved up the stairs. Once inside, he heard a noise from up the second set of stairs that he later understood to have been a gunshot. Ofc. Veeneman confirmed that he did not directly see the shooting incident and was not certain who fired.

Ofc. Musgrove was heard reporting that he had kicked a knife away from the subject after the shooting. Ofc. Veeneman stated he did not recall the names of the subject or victim, but the victim did say, "Thank you," to officers after the incident.

When Ofc. Veeneman had nothing further to add, the interview terminated at approximately 0019 hours.

Ofc. Veeneman was wearing an activated body-worn camera (BWC) during the entirety of the incident. Both the BWC video and the recorded audio interview with BCI are stored in Axon and accessible through this case file.
