Narrative:

On 02/24/2026 at approximately 1410 hours, Special Agent David Hammond (S/A Hammond) was contacted by Lead Crime Scene Technician Michael Rostocil. He advised that the Parma Police Department was involved in an officer involved critical incident in Brooklyn, Ohio. They requested assistance from the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) in examining the scene and collecting potential evidence. S/A Hammond and Senior Special Agent Edward Lulla (S/A Lulla) accepted the request.

S/A Hammond and S/A Lulla arrived at the scene at approximately 1700 hours (response from London, Ohio). The scene was located in the roadway at 10810 Brookpark Rd. in Brooklyn, Cuyahoga County. This area was predominantly commercial businesses, with restaurants and shopping. The closest business to the area of incident was an IHOP Restaurant. The GPS coordinates for the location were: 41°27'7" N 81°45'37" W. Weather conditions at the time of the examination were 32 degrees and mostly sunny with light winds.

The crime scene was photographed as it was found. Digital images were uploaded to Evidence.com. The scene was also scanned using a BLK Leica 360 scanner (Evidence.com upload). S/A Hammond and S/A Lulla utilized personal protection equipment during the scene examination.

The crime scene was secure upon arrival. A large portion of the roadway had been cordoned off with crime scene tape. The area was protected with officer presence. Special Agent Doug Burke (S/A Burke) was leading the BCI Force Investigation Unit portion of the investigation. Agents assisting at the scene included Special Agent John Tingley, Special Agent Darien Spann, Special Agent Jesse Bynum and Special Agent Joseph Lamping.

Investigators were able to provide a limited briefing about the incident. Parma Police Officers were investigating a report of suicidal / at-risk person in the area. They observed a vehicle matching the description and conducted a traffic stop. They
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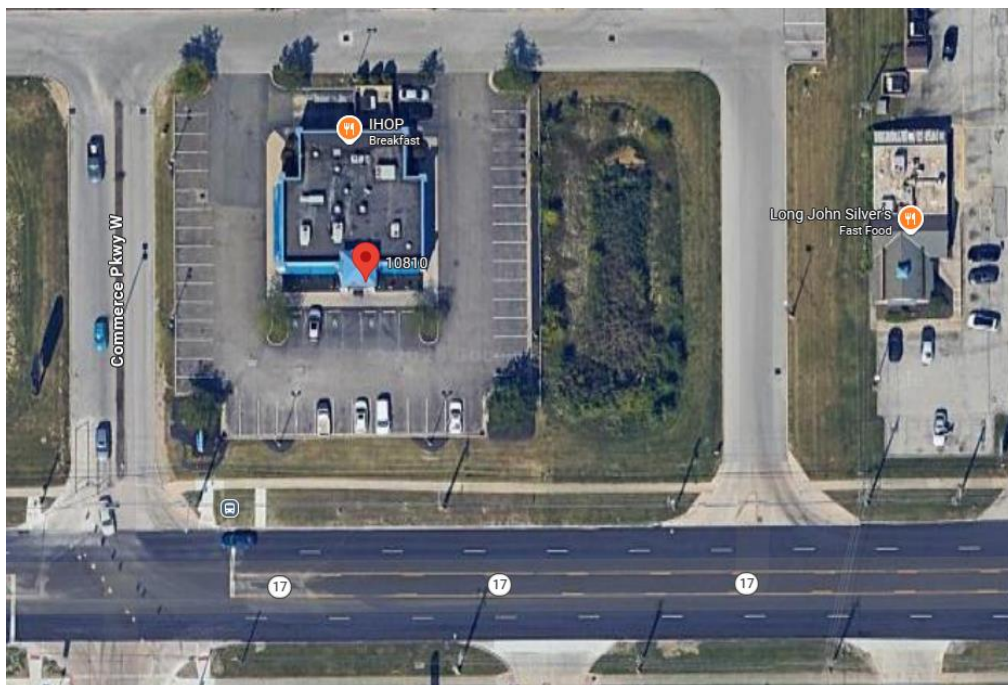


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reported that the subject exited the vehicle with a weapon in his hand and moved toward officers. Two police officers fired their weapons, and the subject was subsequently struck by gunfire. He was transported from the scene and was later pronounced deceased. No officers were injured during the incident.

This area of roadway runs east and west. There were two lanes of travel for both directions of travel in addition to a center, turn lane.

Investigators were advised that two patrol vehicles were present at the time of the incident. Parma Police Cruiser 169 (black, Chevy Tahoe) was parked in the north-most, west bound lane close to utility pole CEI 30358. Parma Police Cruiser [REDACTED] (black and white, Chevy Tahoe) was parked slightly behind Parma Cruiser 169 in the south, west bound lane. Both vehicles had their emergency lights activated and were clearly marked police units. Both were equipped with dash mounted camera systems.

A third police cruiser (Parma 152, black, Chevy, Silverado) was parked west bound in the east bound lanes of travel. This vehicle was said to have arrived post incident.

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The subject's vehicle was parked in the north-most, west bound lane of travel, in front of Parma Police Cruiser 169. The subject's vehicle information was:

Prior to crime scene unit arrival, investigators identified several items of potential evidence with placards. These placards were left in place for crime scene unit photography and evidence identification. BCI Investigators also advised that they had taken some overall photographs of the scene as they worked to assist in identifying areas of evidence.

Four fired cartridge casings were located on the south side of Parma Police Cruiser [REDACTED]. One fired cartridge casing (item 1) was located in the east bound lane, behind Parma Cruiser 152. Three additional cartridge casings were found in or near the center turn lane (items 2-4)

A check of the roadway beneath cruise [REDACTED] located two additional fired cartridge casings (items 10 & 11).

Four fired cartridge casings were located in a cluster along the lane marker (white line) separating the north and south, west bound lanes of travel. These cartridge casings were located at the passenger side rear quarter panel of Parma Police Unit [REDACTED]. These cartridge casings were identified with placards 6-9.

An area of red-brown staining, visually consistent with blood, was located in the roadway near the driver's side quarter panel of Parma Police Cruiser 169. It appeared that medical treatment of the subject may have taken place in this area. A package of gauze and a tourniquet was located nearby. A pair of black framed, mirrored sunglasses were also located in this area. They were collected as evidence (item5).

A wallet and Samsung cellphone were located on the hood area of Parma Police Cruiser 169. These items were identified as 12 & 13 in crime scene photographs. The wallet was black in color and constructed of leather or a similar material. It was equipped with a zipper. A cursory examination of the contents located a social security card for Ricardo Yuuki Davis and two debit cards in the same name.

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The cell phone was listed as item 19 on the scene inventory form. The phone did not have power at the time of collection.

S/A Hammond was made aware that handgun was located in the roadway by officers at the scene and secured in the driver's seat of Parma PD Cruiser 169. The handgun was identified with a disposable placard (13) in photographs. The weapon was found with no ammunition, the slide in the rear-lock position. There was no magazine present in the well. The weapon is listed on the search inventory form as 13. The weapons information was:

Investigators advised that a search warrant for the Toyota Carola had been obtained. Examination of the exterior surfaces of the car located two ballistic impacts (BI) along the driver's side. The first area of damage was located in the rear, driver's side quarter panel above the rear taillight. This area of damage was identified as BI 1.0. It appears that a projectile perforated the outer metal at a curved area of the car. The ballistic impact was large and irregular in shape.

The margins of the hole were pushed in, consistent with an entrance. A parabolic shape was present at the forward edge of the impact area. The projectile perforated the outer surface of the metal and continued into an area of weather stripping. The

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projectile then entered the lid of the trunk. Corresponding defects were documented with photography. The trunk lid was not cut open to recover the fired bullet. A rod was placed in the defects to estimate the trajectory. The projectile originated from a point to the south and east of the ballistic impact. This was documented with photography and digital scans.

The second ballistic impact was located on the pillar of the car, forward the driver's seat. This impact was located near the top of the driver's window. The area of damage was identified as BI 2.0. It appears that a projectile impacted this area but did not penetrate the metal. A lead in mark was present on the exterior side of the impact. Paint fractures were present, consistent with a projectile impacting the pillar from the exterior side of the vehicle, traveling in the direction of the windshield.

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A search of the interior of the car located several items of potential evidence. A black backpack was located on the front passenger seat. The bag contained multiple storage areas. A black plastic bag was located in the large, rear pouch. The plastic bag contained an orange and white cardboard box used to package a Taurus handgun. The box had the brand "Taurus" printed on it. An inventory sticker was affixed to the end of the box. It listed the contents as: G2C 9mm 3.26. BR/MS Green, 2 X 12 RDS, AEH630415. The box contained a safety lock as well as manuals. No weapon was located inside the handgun box.

The front pouch of the book bag contained a gum drop themed gift bag with two pieces of paper. The papers had handwritten notes that read:

"Reasons Why I Shot Myself:

Long term unemployment (Late September till now)

Student Loans

Failing at Life

No Relationships

No Close Bonds

The Unfairness of Life

Being a Misfit

Social Expectations

I deserve to die".

The second note read: "Phone Passkey 6608".

Also located in one of the smaller pouches in the front of the bag were two, twelve round handgun magazines. The magazines were loaded with two and three unfired PMC brand, full metal jacket rounds (total of five). A box of PMC 9mm ammunition was located inside the book bag. The fifty round box contained forty-two rounds of ammunition.

Also located on the front passenger seat was a white plastic shopping bag that contained thick, orange rope. The rope was a Hyper Tough, Solid-Braided Poly Rope, ½ Diameter x 75 ft. A receipt was present in the bag:

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Walmart, 10000 Brookpark Rd. Cleveland, Ohio. 1 item sold (Rope). Purchased 02/24/2026 at 13:37. Purchased with a debit card.

A check of the rear seat located a Cosco 3 step ladder. It was photographed but not retained as evidence.

At the conclusion of the crime scene examination all items of evidence were turned over to Special Agent Darien Spann (02/24/2026 at 1947 hours). S/A Hammond and S/A Lulla cleared from the scene at approximately 2000 hours.

Please refer to an investigative report by S/A Lulla regarding a secondary vehicle at the scene that was impacted by a bullet.

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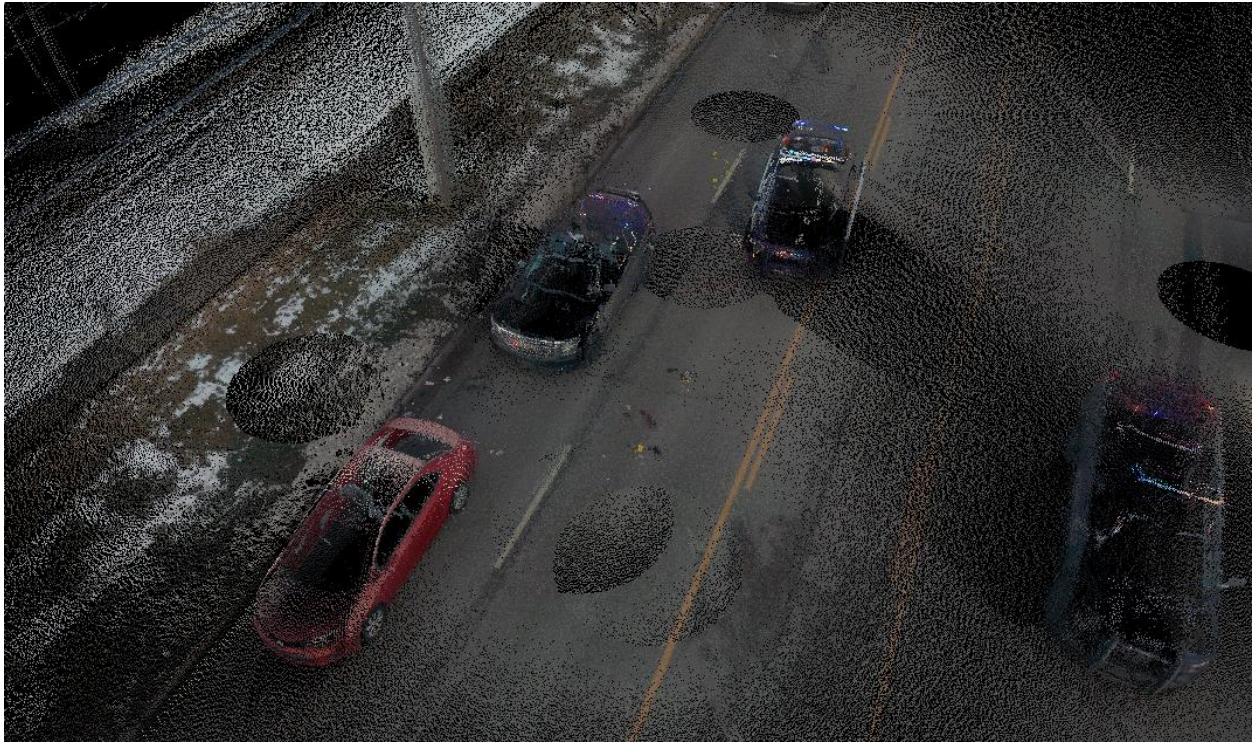
