deem necessary; or in any county in which there is no such society organized as provided by law, if there should remain in such fund a sum in excess of five thousand dollars, after all legitimate expenses chargeable to such fund have been paid, any sum in excess of such five thousand dollars shall be transferred to the county general fund."

As I read the above statute it clearly appears to heve been the intent of the Legislature that after the county commissioners had paid all necessary expenses of the administration of the sections of the General Code relating to the registration, licensing, impounding and destroying of dogs, and had made compensation for injuries to live stock inflicted by dogs, and further had paid to the humane society such amount from the dog and kennel fund as the commissioners deemed necessary for the uses and purposes of such society, the fund should accumulate until an excess of \$5,000.00 was accumulated above all legitimate expenses chargeable to the fund before the money should be transferred to the county general fund; and for that reason, transfers from this fund in the manner provided by Section 5625–13, Subdivision "D", General Code, as amended by the 88th General Assembly, are not authorized.
