Narrative:

On April 8, 2022, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Al Banský (Banský) received the personnel file for Officer Tom Schneeman (Schneeman) from Struthers Police Department (Chief Tim Roddy). SA Banský reviewed the personnel file and noted the following:

The personnel file consisted of 127 pages. Schneeman was placed on paid administrative leave, presumably as the result of the officer-involved shooting.

Schneeman had several letters of minor disciplinary action in his file, along with several letters of commendations. No discipline or complaints related to the use of force were observed in the documentation received.

Note: Schneeman was involved in another officer-involved critical incident in August 2021. This incident is still currently under review (BCI investigation) with the Mahoning County Prosecutor's Office.

On April 27, 2022, SA Banský received the results of the drug screen performed on Schneeman on April 2, 2022, at 11:32 hours, at E-Screen. The records indicated a result of "Negative."








OATH OF PROMISE

Chief- Dispatcher Schneeman successfully tested at the FQO (fully qualified operator) level this date. His CCH was run as per LEADS requirement. As I informed you, there are several significant felony entries on his CCH that may need to be disclosed to LEADS.

It appears that through Pennsylvania he had five (5) charges that were "not processed/(withdrawn)." This information can be verified through the WHITEHALL POLICE DEPARTMENT, (412.884.1100). As all five charges are listed as "withdrawn" (not prosecuted) *I do not believe these will be an issue with maintaining his LEADS access certification.*

However, he has two (2) carrying concealed weapons charges (M1) and one (1) resisting arrest (M2) charges through Ohio (Kent Police Department, ORI OH0670330). All three charges appear to stem from the same incident date of November 14, 2011. Due to the nature of these charges he has an "Approach With Caution" BCI qualifier on his entry.



UC/CS Rescue

Concept:

A target has been identified as selling Methamphetamine in the City of Hogan. DTO's have acquired a source that can conduct an introduction with the target. The introduction is to acquire ¼ ounce of methamphetamine. The introduction can occur at any of the locations or inside a vehicle.

Roll players:

A minimum of three roll players. Target, UC and CS. Others can be used as patrons etc. Roll players will be rotated and so will the scenarios. Don't use the same scenario. Change it up.

Scenarios:

- 1- Introduction goes well and UC is able to make a purchase.
- 2- At the introduction the target claims to have a debt owed by the CS. Things escalate but the UC and CS are able to deescalate the situation and depart.
- 3- During the introduction the UC and the target exit and enter a vehicle to conduct the transaction. The introduction can go good or turn bad with the UC and target fighting (no weapons). Roll players to decide.
- 4- UC gives the money to the target. Target departs and enters a vehicle and robs the UC.
- 5- If residential or hotel- The meet goes bad and the target shoots the CS in the leg from a debt that was never paid.
- 6- Meet goes bad and UC shoots the target.
- 7- UC goes down and rescue is needed. UC can be responsive or not.

Cautions:

- 1- Simmunitions can only be used in certain areas. If a no-sims area is used for training, roll players will have to either just point firearms or use the concept of a stabbing. Use the Casper APP and vocalize the actions that occur.
- 2- Safety equipment worn by all.

Vehicle Take Downs

Concept:

- (A) A target has been identified as selling Cocaine in the City of Hogan. DTO's have acquired a source and have obtained two controlled purchases of Cocaine. Intel gained from the buys and CS is that the target will obtain a kilo of cocaine from the post office. Once obtained it is unknown where the target may go. It was decided to take down the target once the package is obtained.
- (B) A target has been identified as selling Cocaine in the City of Hogan. DTO's have acquired a source and have obtained two controlled purchases of Cocaine. Intel gained from the buys and CS is that the target will obtain a kilo of cocaine from an unknown source of supply. The supplier is to come to the residence and drop the Cocaine. The supplier is supposed to obtain monies owed and then depart.

Roll players:

- (A) A minimum of one roll player. Additional roll players can be added for co-conspirators, along with additional vehicles.
- (B) A minimum of two roll players. One supplier and one target. Additional can be added.

Scenarios:

- 1- Target arrives at the Post Office and obtains the package. Take down occurs in the parking lot.
- 2- Target arrives at the Post Office and obtains the package. When the target comes out, he hands the package off to another person in a separate vehicle.
- 3- Target leaves and meets with supplier.
- 4- Supplier arrives meets with target and only supplier leaves.
- 5- Supplier arrives and target gets in vehicle of supplier and both depart.

Cautions:

- 1- Simmunitions can only be used in certain areas. If a no-sims area is used for training, roll players will have to either just point firearms or use the concept of a stabbing. Use the Casper APP and vocalize the actions that occur.
- 2- Safety equipment worn by all.

Residential/Commercial Entry

Concept:

A target has been identified as selling heroin in the City of Hogan. DTO's have conducted three controlled purchases and obtained the probable cause for a search warrant. The target is known to carry a handgun. CCH consists of narcotic sales, felonious assaults, weapons offenses.

Roll players:

A minimum of one but can use up to three. One being the main target and the other two can be either customers or co-conspirators.

Scenarios:

- 1- Target is compliant and gives up in one of the rooms, or comes to door. Additional roll players do the same.
- 2- Target (S) stays outside and upon approach of Officers, Target (S) run inside the residence. Target(s) hide and wait to be found.
- 3- Target(s) establish positions inside in Danger Areas. Target(S) shoot if given the opportunity.
- 4- Target(s) engage Officers upon entry.
- 5- Target(S) engage Officers on approach of the building.
- 6- Target(s) are compliant when Officers enter. One roll player is a heroin user and overdosed inside. That roll player is to be unconscious.

Cautions:

- 1- Simmunitions can only be used in certain areas. If a no-sims area is used for training, roll players will have to either just point firearms or react more aggressively.
- 2- Safety equipment worn by all.

Basic SWAT Qual

June 12th, 2018

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Officers will effectively engage targets with both handgun and rifle.**
- 2. Officers will effectively transition from rifle to handgun and conduct reloads.**
- 3. Officers will effectively engage targets on the move.**
- 4. Officers will effectively engage targets on the move with close body contact.**
- 5. Officers will effectively engage targets from outside the doorway.**
- 6. Officers will effectively engage targets on entry into the room.**

EQUIPMENT:

- 1. Rifle/handgun and ammunition**
- 2. Heavy Vest**
- 3. Eye, Ear Protection**

SUMMARY: Officers will be put through a Weapons flow drill prior to loading their firearms. With Officers in full tactical gear they will complete each objective in a safe and consistent manner. Two instructors must be available for safety precautions. Officers must meet each objective before they can move on to the next one. Barricades are to be utilized to simulate a doorway.

CAUTIONS:

1. Watch muzzle discipline.
2. Ensure Officers are wearing all protective equipment.

OUTLINE: 1. Officers will load three rifle magazines with 2 to 5 rounds each. Handguns will have all magazines fully loaded. Standing at the 9ft distance, Officers will engage targets with rifle. Upon emptying the rifle, Officers will transition to their handgun and engage targets with 2 to 5 rounds. Officers will then conduct a reload of their firearms and conduct the same cycle again. Until ammo is complete for the rifle.

2. Officers (fully loaded magazines) will line up facing outboard from their respective targets, having their weapons in a safe carry position. On the command of "Threat" Officers will look, turn and engage their target. Once the target has been engaged with 2 to 5 rounds, Officers will be told to go back into the carry position, look and turn back outboard. The command of

threat will be issued again and Officers again look, turn and engage. This is to be conducted approx five times.

3. Officers are to pair up with a partner. Both Officers are to stack in a line behind each other with their target being directly behind them. The Officer furthest outboard is to have their firearm in a low ready position. The Officer closest to the target should be in a carry position. On the command of "Threat" both Officers are to look and turn. The closest Officer to the target is to engage the target. The furthest outboard Officer will need to look, turn and then move on line with their partner and then engage their target. This will be conducted 5 times and then Officers positions will be rotated. **Caution Officers to be in a carry position prior to moving.**

4. Officers are to be paired up with a partner. Both Officers are to stack in a line behind each other with their target being directly behind them. The Officer furthest outboard is to have their firearm in a low ready position. The Officer closest to the target should be in a carry position. On the command of "Threat" both Officers are to look and turn. The closest Officer to the target is to engage the target. The furthest outboard Officer will need to look, turn and then move to their partner. Paying special attention to having their muzzle forward, close body contact and outboard foot forward. This will be conducted 5 times and then Officers positions will be rotated. **Caution Officers to be in a carry position prior to moving.**

For the next series of exercises, conduct a weapons free walk through. Instructors will conduct the walk through emphasizing the carry position and movements through the door.

5. Position barricades to simulate a door entry. Position a target in three different locations. One in each corner of the range and one in the center. Officers will move adjacent to the barricades and engage the targets from outside while clearing the room from the outside. This exercise is to simulate engaging targets from a doorway.

6. Position barricades to simulate a door entry. Position a target in three different locations. One, in each corner of the range and one in the center. Officers will move, as a two man team, adjacent to the barricades and engage the targets from outside while clearing the room from the outside. This exercise is to simulate engaging targets from a doorway. Once the targets have been successfully engaged, Officers will move into the room and reengage the targets. **Communication is key on this movement.**

7. Position barricades to simulate a door entry. The barricades will be in an opposite position from 5 and 6. A target will be positioned in the corner that cannot be seen from the doorway. Two Officers will be in position for entry into the simulated room. The first Officer will enter and go in deep enough to make room for the second Officer. Both Officers will then engage the target.

8. Officers will load their magazine with 2 to five rounds each. Officers will remain with a partner. The first Officer, to shoot, will provide their magazines to their partner. The first Officer will position them in a kneeling position. On the command of "threat" the Officer will engage their target. The second officer will throw one magazine at a time between the first officer's legs. When the first officer goes empty on their weapon they will need to find the fresh magazine between their legs and do a reload. The concept of this exercise is ensure the officer keeps their eyes forward and conducts a magazine exchange in their upward work space.

9. A single officer will be seated inside a vehicle that is placed at the far outer boundary of the south range. The Officer will have magazines loaded at variable amounts of no more than five. Officers can use both rifle and handgun. On command officer will exit the vehicle and move rapidly towards the first barricade and engage targets. The officer will continue to move using barricades and engaging targets while being harassed by one AI. There must be a second AI to monitor safety. Concept is to conduct reloads while behind barricades and conduct weapon transitions during movements.

1. Officers will be in a seated position of a chair. Weapons will be empty and cleared by instructors and adjacent Officers. Officers will then stay in the seated position and draw their handgun from the holster. Officers will then obtain a good sight picture of a silhouette target that is approx 5 feet in front of them. After several practice draws, Officers will then load a

full magazine for their handgun and re-holster. Instructors will continuously emphasize muzzle discipline and the elements of the draw. At the command Officers will then draw and engage their target, from the seated position. Officers will fire 2-4 rounds each time and then re-holster. They will then reengage the target at the Officers own pace, until out of ammunition.

Day 1 – Dobbins Elementary School

Safety Briefing

1. No live fire ammunition or weapons capable of firing live fire ammunition are allowed in the Dobbins Elementary School. Personnel who visit Dobbins Elementary School for training or other matters must secure live fire ammunition and weapons in their vehicles. All personnel will be checked to assure compliance upon entry or re-entry.
2. All weapons will be handled as live fire weapons. Training weapons will only be fired in scenarios when their use is indicated by script or by appropriate judgment exercised by the participants. Weapons will be loaded and unloaded in a safe manner. Weapons will also be carried in a safe manner.
3. No weapons should be fired within one foot (12 inches) of a human target. No contact shots are allowed.
4. All activities in a training scenario will cease whenever one of the emergency signals is heard. The emergency signal used during this training will be **CODE RED**. This situation, when an emergency signal is heard, will be referred to hereafter as a cease fire. Upon initially hearing a signal for cease fire, all participants or role players, hold physical moment (unless movement is necessary to secure an unsafe environment or ensure that weapons are safely secured), and await further instructions from the Scenario Evaluator. Any Scenario Evaluator, observer, participant, or role player who observes an unsafe condition is to immediately signal a cease fire. Some examples of unsafe conditions that would require an immediate cease fire are any person observed within 50 yards of the training scenario who is without eye protection; any live fire ammunition or weapon capable of firing live ammunition is observed; any situation that is causing injury or believed to cause injury to any participant, role player, observer, or bystander; or any situation that is likely to cause damage to personal property.
5. All participants in training and role players should wear a minimum of the following safety equipment whenever they are involved in a training scenario: approved full face protection that provides wrap around protection, eye protection; throat protection that covers the neck and throat; gloves or other hand protection that leaves no exposed skin on the hands; groin protection; and clothing that leaves no exposed skin.
6. All participants are jointly responsible for the cleanup of the training area to include picking up brass, picking up expended projectiles, and cleaning marking agent from the building. Clean up all water bottles, coffee cups, and any/all other trash.
7. Treat every weapon as if is loaded. Know the status of your weapon. Do not point the muzzle of the weapon at anything you do not wish to shoot. Do not place your finger inside the trigger guard until you have made the conscience decision to pull the trigger. Be sure of your target, background, and foreground and beyond.



5. Proper ear protection and proper eye protection are required to be worn at all times while on the firing line.
6. Bullet proof vests are also required to be properly worn at all times during this training, with the exception of a break in training or lunch break.
7. When clearing firearms, always check both visually and physically to see that it is unloaded.
8. Follow all and any additional specific safety guidelines provided by the instructors. You are expected to use good judge, and to refrain from attempting any exercise which you may not be able to perform safely, based upon your own ability, equipment, prior training, or physical condition.
9. The instructors of this training course have the expressed authorization to not allow an individual to participate in any given exercise the participant has displayed he/she may not be able to complete in a safe manner based upon his/her own ability, equipment, prior training, physical condition, or any other reason deemed to be a safety risk.

- 0900-0915 **Safety Brief**
- 0915-0945 **Weapons Flow- Rifle and Handgun, Reload drills- Rifle and Handgun. All dry Tactical and Combat**
- 0945-1100 **Shooting Drills (Aim Small Miss Small)**
1. Transition Drill. Officers will load 3 rifle magazines with three rounds each. Three full magazines for handgun. From high ready, At the 15 foot line fire two to the chest one to the head, transition to handgun and fire two to three rounds at chest. Reload rifle and run drill again. Go until all rifle magazines are empty.
 2. The proper demonstration, on how to clear a malfunction, will be shown
 3. Shooting positions Squat and Kneeling. Discussion will be made on reasons for positions and demonstrations will be conducted.

The primary focus of this training will be the transition from primary weapon to handgun. The façade will consist of numerous rooms. Each room will either have an open door, closed door, inward opening and outward opening doors. Officers will work in pairs, with four officers working as a team. Each pair will begin at rooms adjacent to each other. As pairs, Officers will breach door (if needed), one officer will clear the room while the other officer calls out targets. Inside each room will be a series of targets. Each target will either be a letter or symbol. Outside the room will be a laminated sheet containing a letter and a symbol designating the target to shoot inside the room. The officer engaging the targets will be armed with a rifle and handgun. The officer will have rifle in the ready position. Once the first target is seen the Officer will transition to the handgun (weapon failure rifle). Officers can move past the other pair of officers should they not have finished engaging their targets. Fire into paper targets opposite of pillars and windshield. Safety brief will be reiterated prior to firing.

Conduct safety check of weapons. No ammo

1315-1430 Move to area where vehicles are preset for a felony stop. Go over the positions and where the officer can move for cover. How the officers can use the vehicle as cover and how to squat and kneel. One officer and two officers. Do practical exercises of calling people back to be detained. Reiterate what was shown on the ballistic demo. How to approach the vehicle to conduct a final clear.

1430-1500 Clean up.

Day 2

0700-0715- Safety brief

0715-0745- Weapons flow (no ammo). Weapons and Officers will be inspected by instructors and partners for no ammo (3 time check).

0745-0815- Officers will be shown man down drill. Using the vehicle for cover and how to shoot under the vehicle and when. Officers will practice weapons flow (handgun and rifle) around the vehicles. Kneeling, squatting, man down, reloading etc.

*0815-1015- Scenario #1, Vehicles will be set at various positions on the range. Two will be set up as a traffic stop. Numerous paper targets will be placed throughout range around the vehicles. Each target must have a good back stop with no risk of skipped or deflected rounds. Single Officer Traffic stop will be the engagement. Prior to scenario the Officer will ready their patrol rifle (condition 3) in the back seat of the mock Police cruiser. Officer will begin approach to the suspect vehicle. During the approach the instructor will begin to yell out targets for the student to engage. The student will move around the vehicles and engage the called-out targets. The goal will be for the student to move back to the police vehicle and acquire their patrol rifle. The student will then continue to engage targets with both handgun and rifle. The instructor will initiate weapon failures throughout the exercise to cause stress. One of the many training take away will be addressing a malfunction.

There will be a safety officer assigned to the student with their sole purpose to monitor the students shooting and movements (tripping and weapon flagging). The range must be cleared and reviewed for back stops and potential skip rounds prior to each student's exercise.

*0815-1015- Scenario #2, two vehicles will be set up at the north range. Students will work around the vehicles slowly and engage paper targets. Students will be able to see where their rounds impact and have a better understanding of the mechanical offset.

*Scenario 1 and 2 will be rotated on the hour between groups of students.

1015-1045 Lunch

1100-1300- *Two-man movements. A series of targets will be set up as hostage targets, along with steel targets. Barrels will be placed as barricades. Officers will move as partners and rotate positions after each course of fire. Poor shots will be counted against the team. The exercise will consist of officer movements around each other. Steel targets will be signal to transition to handgun. NO RIFLE ON THE STEEL. Poor shooting will count against the team (Example would be missing target or hitting the hostage.) This is a timed event to add stress.

-*Fighting from inside the vehicle. Students will be inside the vehicle and engage targets that are outside the vehicle. This gives the student an idea of getting their weapon out of the holster and how to control the handgun and engage targets.

*The above scenarios will be rotated on the hour between groups of students.

1300-1430- * A felony stop will be set up. Additional vehicles will be set up again with numerous paper targets. Each target will have letters and symbols painted on them. This scenario will consist of two officers. Each officer will be assigned a safety officer to follow with them as they conduct their engagements. Officers will begin at the rear of the mock cruiser. Their rifle will be in the back seat in condition 3. The start of the scenario will begin with the instructor calling out targets. Officers will move throughout the vehicles and engage the called targets. Reloads and weapons malfunctions will be addressed as they occur. The range must be cleared and reviewed for back stops and potential skip rounds prior to each student's exercise

* Steel Tree Exercise- Students will compete with each other on the steel trees.

* The above scenarios will be rotated with one two man team going through the felony stop scenario every ten minutes.


